Oral auction bids will be received by the Forest Supervisor, Fremont National Forest, Post Office Building, Lakeview, Oregon, beginning at 10:00 a.m., October 19, 1955, for all the timber marked or designated for cutting and all merchantable dead timber located on an area embracing about 600 acres within Sections 33 and 34, T. 30 S., R. 15 E.; Sections 3 and 4, T. 37 S., R. 15 E.; Section 25, T. 36 S., R. 15 E.; and Section 2, T. 37 S., R. 15 E., W.M., Round Butte Area, Fremont National Forest, Oregon, estimated to be 6,800,000 board feet, more or less, of live and recently dead (sound sapwood) ponderosa pine, 60,000 board feet, more or less, of live and recently dead (sound sapwood) white fir and other species, and an unestimated amount of older dead (unsound sapwood) timber of all species. No bid of less than \$29.90 per M board feet for live and recently dead (sound sapwood) ponderosa pine, \$2.00 per M board feet for live and recently dead (sound sapwood) white fir and other species, and \$1.00 per M board feet for older dead (unsound sapwood) timber of all species will be considered. The price bid for all species except older dead (unsound sapwood) timber shall be subject to quarterly calendar adjustment upward or downward by 0.5 of the difference between the base index prices determined as set forth below and the average of the Western Pine Association index prices as calculated by the Forest Service at the end of each quarter. Such adjustment in the stumpage rates shall be applicable to timber cut and scaled during the calendar quarter for which the adjustment is computed. In no event, however, will the adjusted stumpage rates for each quarter be less than \$5.00 per M board feet for live and recently dead (sound sapwood) ponderosa pine, and \$2.00 per M board feet for live and recently dead (sound sapwood) white fir and other species. The base index prices for this sale are an average of the monthly Western Pine Association lumber price indices from July 1, 1954 to June 30, 1955. In addition to the prices bid for stumpage a cooperative deposit of \$9.50 per M board feet of live and recently dead (sound sapwood) sawtimber of all species to be used by the Forest Service for paying the cost of slash disposal, and a cooperative deposit of \$2.75 per M board feet of live and recently dead (sound sapwood) ponderosa pine sawtimber to cover the cost of tree planting, seed sowing and timber stand improvement work on the area cut over will be required. 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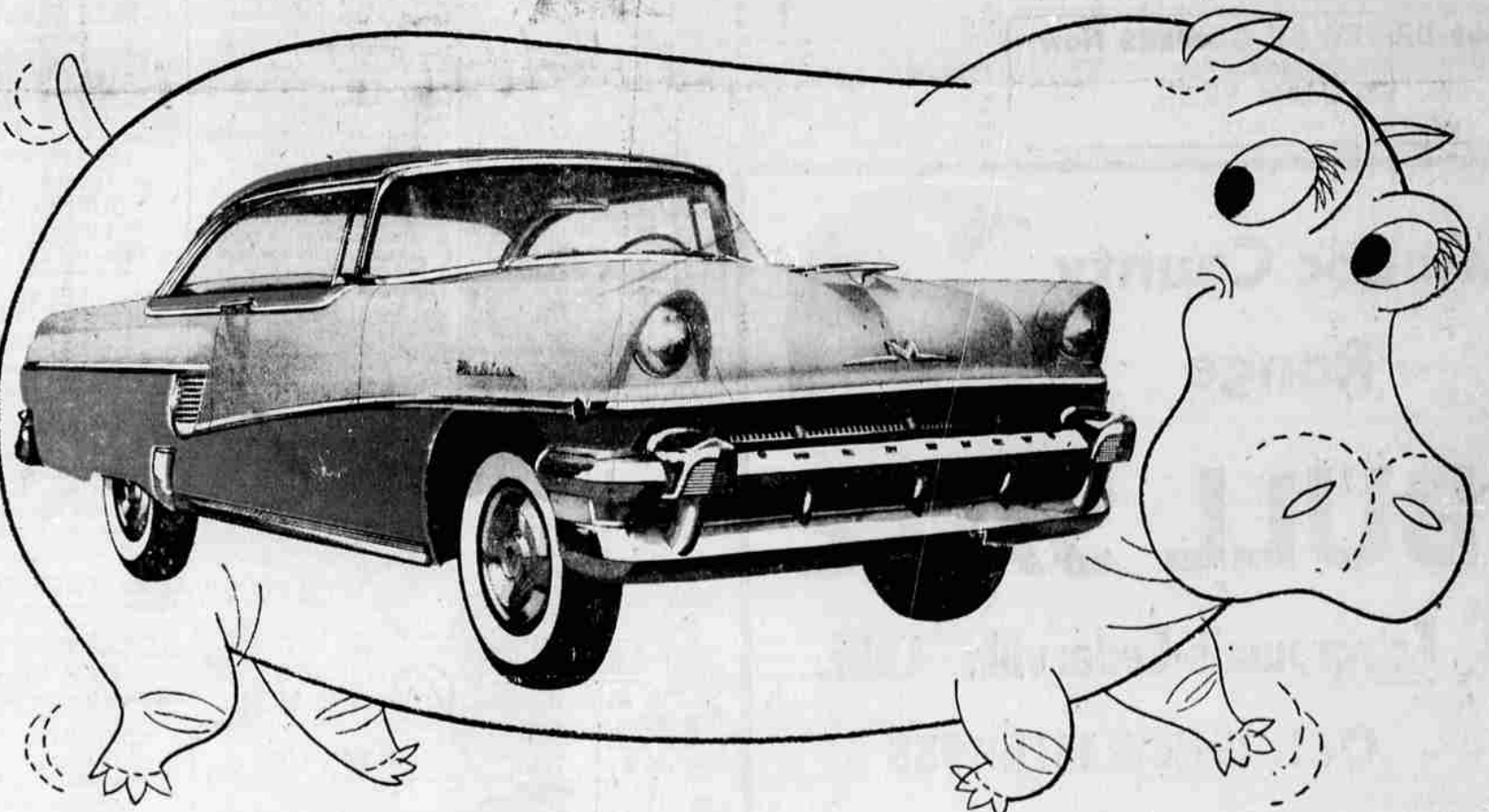
