Canadian Pros Have Problems

CALGARY (UP) — Trouble rocked Canadian pro football Wednesday — the Calgary Stampede are sure they lost a game because a player tipped off the opposition, and the Ottawa Rough Riders are shaking up their roster after finishing 30 players \$200 each for sub-par performances.

The Stampede, who Tuesday fired guard Dean Bandiera after accusing him of revealing their plays to the Winnipeg Blue Bombers, were reported considering a request to Western Interprovincial Football Union officials for a replay of last Saturday's game. The Bombers won it, 13-12.

It seemed unlikely such a request would be honored, however, League President Jack Row and already has commented he didn't "think it really mattered much because Winnipeg probably already knew the Calgary plays anyway."

Bandiera denied the charge. "I'm innocent of everything they accused me of," he said. "Just because I happen to be friendly with a certain player on the Winnipeg team, they accuse me of divulging plays."

There was no comment from the Winnipeg club owners or players on the matter.

The Ottawa players were fined \$100 for each of the last two games. The club announcement said the fines were imposed "for failure to exhibit the caliber of football of which the players are capable."

The announcement added "immediate steps are being taken to secure replacements in an endeavor to strengthen the team."

The Big Four club did not identify the players or reveal how many American imports were involved. The Rough Riders were whipped 35-7 and 43-6 in two weekend games with Montreal. The team record is 2-5 this season.

USSR Or US Top Topic In Olympic Talk

SAN FRANCISCO (UP) — Who is going to win the 1956 Olympic Games at Melbourne, the United States or Russia?

American sports fans find that question a good topic for spirited debate. But members of the International Olympic Committee find it a fearsome thing, a danger to their cherished ideals of Olympic competition.

With physical arrangements for the Melbourne games nearing completion, the men behind the Olympics are turning their attention more and more to the fierce nationalism that spawns the question and keeps it alive.

"The Olympic Games are contests between individuals," president Avery Brundage of the international committee said Wednesday. "They are not—and they must not become—contests between nations to decide the superiority of one nation over another, or of one political system over another."

Brundage and Lewis Lutton, chairman of the organizing committee for next year's games, pleaded with newsmen to do what they could to abolish—or at least minimize—the use of any unofficial point system to determine the leading teams in Olympic competition.

Lutton said point systems were ridiculous. "How," he asked, "can you balance a gold medal won by tiny Luxembourg against a gold medal won by the United States? How can you balance a gold medal won in the marathon against a gold medal for being a member of the championship gymnastics team?"

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PITTSBURGH (UP) — The Pittsburgh Pirates acquired right-handed Jackie Brown from their New Orleans farm club today in exchange for pitchers Vernon (Jake) Thies and Cal Hogue.

BUFFALO, N.Y. (UP) — The Buffalo Bisons were assured today of operating an International League franchise in 1956, thanks to a \$70,000 loan by a group of civic-minded citizens.

The loan, in addition to \$75,000 raised by a public sale of stock during a month-long drive, approximated the \$150,000 figure quoted by the Detroit Tigers when they granted a 30-day option to purchase the club to John C. Stigmeier and Harry Bigsler.

NEW YORK (UP) — The International Boxing Club announced four TV-radio fights for Madison Square Garden and one for Baltimore today. All are 10-rounders.

In the most significant match, featherweight contenders Carmelo Costa of Brooklyn and Gabriel (Flash) Elorde of the Philippines will fight on Nov. 11 in the Garden for a shot at Sandy Saddler's title.

Lightweight Lulu Perez of Brooklyn will meet Johnny Gonzales of Oakland, Calif., at the Garden, Oct. 28.

On Nov. 2, lightweight contender Frankie Ryan of New York squares off against ex-champion Paddy DeMarco of Brooklyn at the Baltimore Coliseum.

Willie Pastrano of New Orleans, third-ranked light heavyweight aspirant, engages Joey Rowan of Philadelphia at the Garden on Nov. 18. And a middleweight slugger match is slated for the Garden on Nov. 25 between Eduardo Lausse of Argentina and Gene Fullmer of West Jordan, Utah.

KANSAS CITY (UP) — The Kansas City Athletics, who recently dropped a working agreement with the Springfield, Ark., of the Class C Cotton States League, have signed a similar agreement with Crowley, La., of the Class C Evangeline League.

HOLLYWOOD (UP) — Ralph Dunas of New Orleans, second ranking lightweight, has signed to meet Lou Filipo of Los Angeles, in a 10-round bout at the Hollywood Legion Stadium, Oct. 29.

NEW YORK (UP) — Belair Stud's Nashua, third on the all-time money-winning list, heads a field of 12 nominees for Saturday's running of the \$75,000 added Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont Park. The 2-mile race will be Nashua's last start of the year.

BALTIMORE (UP) — Frankie Ryan of New York, last year's "rookie of the year," in boxing, has signed to meet ex-lightweight champion Paddy DeMarco of New York in a 10-round TV-radio bout at the Baltimore Coliseum, Nov. 2.

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Trabert Joins Pro Net Ranks

LOS ANGELES (UP) — Top tennis player Tony Trabert today faced a new and strenuous career on the courts of the world and a chance to earn \$100,000 as a newly turned professional.

The strapping 25-year-old star from Cincinnati, the 1955 Wimbledon and United States amateur champion, formally signed a 16-month contract to play for and against promoter Jack Kramer.

Today both the veteran Kramer and Trabert sat back to await word from two other prospective members of the tour, Rosewall and Lewis Hoad of Australian Davis Cup fame.

Kramer said the two young Aussies have until Oct. 17 to make up their minds about quitting the amateur ranks. He said he believes they will accept his terms, a reported \$30,000 apiece.

Kramer admitted the Trabert contract was better than the \$75,000 he guaranteed Frank Sedgman of Australia several years ago, and he said that if all goes well, crew-cropped Tony should gross \$100,000 for the 200 matches he faces.

Kramer also revealed that Trabert's contract has two clauses, one contingent on a two-man tour with himself, and the other and better one based on the presence of the two young Aussies. Kramer, 34, may be in for rough competition.

In Manila, Hoad acknowledged Kramer had offered him about \$50,000 but that he wouldn't make a decision until he returned to Australia later this week. Rosewall said he would not decide until he talked to his parents.

OLYMPIC GAMES
NEW YORK (UP) — The United States Olympic Committee, still lacking about \$600,000 for next year's Olympic Games in Cortina, Italy, and Melbourne, Australia, will hold a gala "Olympic Sports Carnival" in Madison Square Garden, Oct. 20, with many of the nation's top athletes on hand to help raise funds.

Leading U.S. prospects in track, figure-skating, fencing, wrestling, gymnastics and weight-lifting will perform in the mammoth event in an effort to help close the gap in needed funds.
