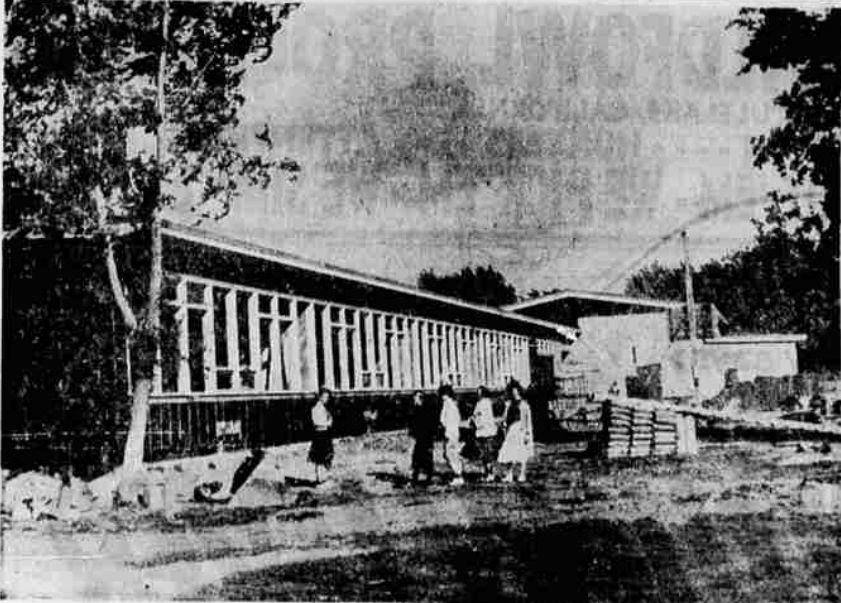




ALMOST READY FOR OCCUPANCY is the new Tulelake Field Experiment Station of the University of California College of Agriculture. The \$20,000 addition to the station should be completed by next week, according to Burt Hoyle, manager of the field station.



CONSTRUCTION WORK on the new unit of the Tulelake Elementary School is going ahead on schedule as class work continues in the older part of the school plant. The \$312,000 project will add nine classrooms, a multiple purpose room, audio-visual and music room, health room, teachers' room, principal's office, rest rooms and wide aisles to the present unit. Contractor is Louis Kowolowski, who is also building the new high school.

Soviets Rap Dulles Speech

MOSCOW, (AP)—Soviet newspapers Wednesday described Secretary of State Dulles' Miami speech as "counter to the spirit of Geneva." They printed a Tass dispatch from Washington saying Dulles tried to "sow distrust of the peaceful policy pursued by the U.S.S.R."

This was the only report published here on Dulles' address to the American Legion convention. This marks a change in signals. The policy recently in the Soviet Press has been to print extended excerpts of such speeches and give Soviet readers an opportunity to judge the contents.

Pravda, at the same time, declared the unification of Germany can be brought about only by prior establishment of the Soviet-sponsored system of collective European security. In this both East and West Germany would be members. Pravda denounced the Western view that German unification is a precondition for establishment of a security system.

These views are being published only two weeks before the opening of the Big Four foreign ministers' meeting at Geneva.

Mine Congress Seeks Changes

LAS VEGAS (UP)—The American Mining Congress today sought a revision of general mining laws to provide a "reasonable period of protection" for anyone making discoveries.

The congress, meeting here in convention, adopted a resolution lauding Congress for legislation which prevented land racketeering through filing of mining claims "in bad faith." At the same time, the AMC urged that, because of increased reliance on expensive, modern equipment for prospecting, laws be revised to give the "reasonable period of protection" after the discovery is made.

The AMC also lauded the opening of vast new areas for exploration which previously were closed. The congress, however, announced its opposition to granting states any rights in public domain lands which interfere with mining. It also opposed extension of the Lasing act system to minerals and metals.

Other resolutions adopted yesterday by the AMC called for: Liberalization of qualifications necessary for "worthy" mining enterprises to get loans from the government's Small Business Administration.

Reconsideration by Congress of the securities and exchange laws, rules and regulations to "correct obstructive and unnecessary features."
