Mayor Gets Accidental Death List

A comprehensive analysis of drowning accidents in this area since 1925 to the present time was submitted to Mayor Paul Landry Friday by Dr. Selma M. Kerron, Klamath County health officer.

The report was compiled by Dr. Kerron at the request of the mayor to assist members of the Fence the Canal Committee and city officials who are working for safeguards at the "Lake Swana." Dr. Kerron's report shows that since 1925, 26 persons have drowned in the canal. The victims ranged from three to 66 years in age.
