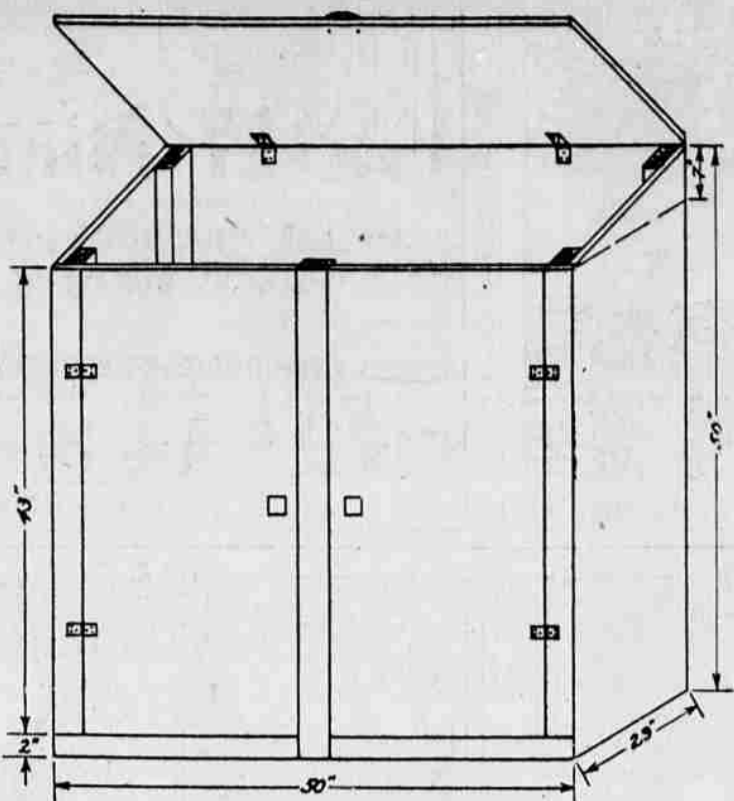


TRASH CAN CONTAINER

TRASH CAN CONTAINERS will be required of all commercial and business establishments in Klamath Falls that keep waste matter outside their buildings, according to city ordinance 4742 which became effective October 13. These containers, which should be painted green, are to be of wood or metal construction, 50 inches long, 43 inches high and 29 inches wide. There must be a lid that opens upwards and two doors on the front that open out. The flooring shall be of boards with a minimum thickness of not less than one and five-eighths inches. These boxes are designed to hold up to two 50 gallon containers and it is hoped they will prevent the spread of rubbish and trash that blows away with the wind as well as serving to control flies and other insects. Full information regarding these trash containers may be had by calling the office of the police judge in the city hall.

Senator Johnson Returns To Work

DALLAS, Tex. (AP)—Senate Democratic Leader Lyndon B. Johnson, who suffered a heart attack last July, may be back on the job in Washington next week.
He said he would attend a scheduled conference with administration leaders on foreign policy if his doctor allows it.
Here for a day at the State Fair of Texas in honor of Speaker Sam Rayburn and himself, Johnson appeared healthy and strong.
"I'm going to cooperate with whoever is in authority during Mr. Eisenhower's illness," he said. "Until Ike gets back on the job, I think all of us should avoid politicking or saying or doing anything that would unsettle the country."

National Bank Reports Gains

Figures released to the comptroller of the currency as of October 5 indicate that the United States National bank has marked up a better than 12 per cent increase in deposits since the October, 1954 report.
U.S. National deposits now total \$762,063,269 which is a gain of more than 86 million dollars during the past 12 months.
The Klamath Falls branch reported deposits in the amount of \$13,815,770.83, according to W. A. Huggins, manager.
U.S. National also showed gains in total resources which rose from \$722,933,021 a year ago to \$827,562,848 at present.
Loans and discounts for the statewide banking system increased more than 46 million dollars. The 12-month gain gives U.S. National:
