BON BON COOKIES are fun and easy to make. Each one has a surprise filling inside. Betty Crocker introduced this new cookie idea at the Newspaper Food Editor conference in Chicago on October 4.

Bon Bon Cookies

These Bon Bon Cookies are the original recipe of a young Montana housewife, Billie Wallace, who lives with her husband and four children at Sand Gulch near Pipestone Creek between Butte and Whitehall.

Long a Betty Crocker fan, she has given General Mills a brand new frosted cookie that will be a taste delight in every home where it is tried.

Because Mrs. Wallace liked chocolate covered cherries, she experimented until she had produced a cherry cookie that was like a bon bon and was still a cookie. Betty Crocker introduced the recipe at the Newspaper Food Editors conference in Chicago the first week in October. Here is the recipe:

BON BON COOKIES
 1/2 cup soft butter
 3/4 cup sifted confectioner's sugar
 1 tablespoon vanilla
 1 1/2 cups sifted Gold Medal Flour
 1/4 teaspoon salt
 Mix butter, sugar and vanilla. Stir in flour and salt. Mix well with hand. Put dough, if desired, in 1/2 inch round cookie cutters around a candied or maraschino cherry or 1 teaspoon chocolate-coconut mixture. Place close together on ungreased baking sheet. Bake 12 to 15 minutes at 350 degrees. Cool and frost by dipping top of cookie into icing.

food coloring if desired. For chocolate icing, add 1 square unsweetened, melted chocolate and use 1/4 cup of cream. Decorate. Makes 20 to 25 cookies.

CHOCOLATE DOUGH
 To basic recipe, add 1 square unsweetened chocolate, melted.

COOKIE CENTERS
 For chocolate-coconut centers, mix 1 square unsweetened chocolate, melted, and 1/2 cup shredded coconut. Mold 1 teaspoonful into tiny balls. For easier handling, refrigerate.

For other centers, use mixture of raisins, chopped dates, candied fruit, chocolate chips and nuts. Mold into tiny balls and wrap dough around the centers and bake as above.
