Norblad Urges Air Base Move

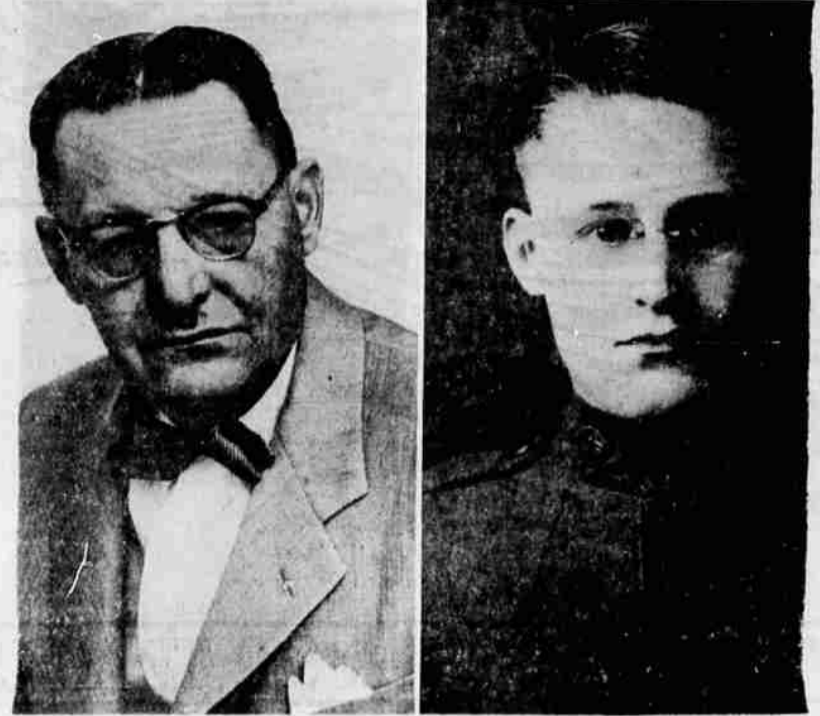
SALEM - The Portland Air Force base should be moved to Clatsop airport at Astoria, Rep. Norblad (R-Ore) says in a letter to Gen. Nathan F. Twining, Air Force chief of staff.

The letter was released by his office here Saturday. He said there are conflicts between the Portland airport authorities and the Air Force on location of some facilities and use of others and "agreement is virtually impossible."

Norblad said that as a member of the House Armed Services Committee he had tried to work out a solution over a period of years but he now believes a move is the best one.

He said the Clatsop facilities could be expanded to take care of Air Force needs and he recommended a change in the "immediate future."
