OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) - A flurry of defense motions designed to gain a delay were presented at the sanity hearing of Otto Loel, accused slayer of a California housewife, started Monday, before Dist. Judge W. Van Meter.

The sanity hearing will determine whether Loel is mentally capable to stand trial on a murder charge growing out of the brutal killing of Mrs. Elizabeth Jeanne Henderson 31, Compton, Calif. Mrs. Henderson was slain in a motel here Jan. 10, 1964, stabbed 13 times.

Loel is 42, a white male, 5'10", 160 lbs. He is a former Marine and was in the service from 1954 to 1958. He was married five times and has five children.

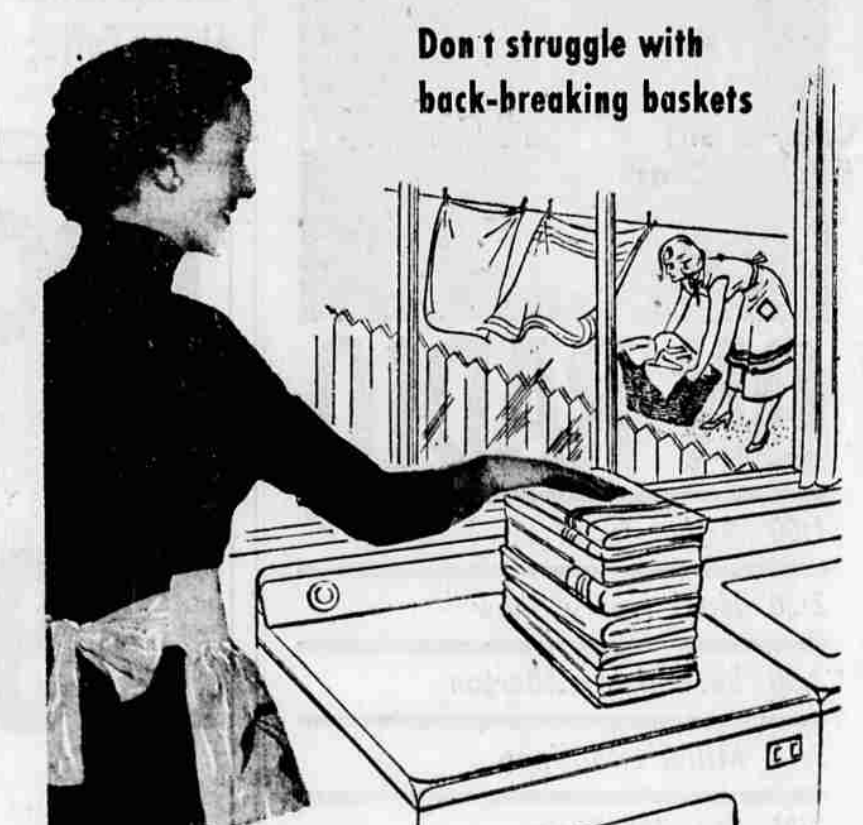
