Democrat Chiefs Plan Speeches

PORTLAND (AP) — Monroe Sweetland, Democratic national committee man for Oregon, reported here Saturday that three men who have been mentioned for the Democratic presidential nomination, will speak in Oregon.

Adlai Stevenson, the party's standard bearer in the 1952 campaign, will visit the state "soon after the first of the year," Sweetland said.

Gov. Averell Harriman of New York is to speak at a \$5-a-plate fund raising banquet in Clackamas County Dec. 22.

Sen. Keafauer (D-Tenn.) will be invited to Oregon also, Sweetland said.

Meantime Republican Party leaders expressed doubt that Vice President Nixon will be able to attend the Republican Western States Conference scheduled for Nov. 2-6 in Portland.

They said that the President's recent heart attack may keep Nixon in Washington on government business.

Peron Takes Up Interment

ASUNSION, Paraguay (AP) — Juan D. Peron drove away to interment on a ranch in southern Paraguay Monday—the 10th anniversary of the great demonstration which thrust him to supreme power in Argentina.

At 5 a.m., his car left the home of wealthy friends in the Paraguayan capital, where he has been staying since his exile from Argentina a month ago. He was headed for the estate near Villarrica where the Paraguayan government has promised to intern him. Argentina has asked that Peron be interned far enough from the border so he could not cause trouble.

Chou Said Ready To Meet Dulles

HONG KONG (AP) — Premier Chou En-Lai of Red China is ready to meet U.S. Secretary of State Dulles a member of a Japanese delegation to Peiping reported Monday.

Yoshihiko Kikajimi, a Tokyo city councilor who was among 47 Japanese municipal officials who visited Red China, said he talked with Chou at a reception in Peiping Oct. 2. He quoted the Communist premier as saying he is willing to confer with Dulles if such a meeting is needed to improve relations between Peiping and Washington.

Woman Dies From Crash Injuries

PORTLAND (AP) — Mrs. Bertah Willey, 78, injured when struck by a car, died in a hospital Saturday night.

It was Portland's 29th traffic fatality of the year.

The driver of the car, identified as Edward M. Bombrowe, 21, of Amboy, Wash., was cited for failure to yield right of way to a pedestrian, police said.

Mediator Seeks Phone Strike End

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Federal Mediator Arthur Viat made another attempt today to end a week-long strike against the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company in Northern California and Nevada.

Viat asked negotiators for the PT&T and the CIO Communications Workers of America to meet with him today. An initial round of conciliation talks ended last Saturday with both sides "at the same place they were when the strike began."

The strike began last Monday when 17,500 members of the CIO-CWA and 4500 commercial and accounting employees belonging to two independent unions left their jobs to back demands for higher wages.

Turkish Leader Renamed To Post

ANKARA, Turkey (AP) — Turkish Premier Adnan Menderes was re-elected president of his ruling Democratic Party early Monday by an overwhelming majority despite a revolt against his leadership by 19 party members in parliament.

A total of 1,254 delegates to the party congress voted for the 56-year-old prime minister. The number of votes against him was not reported but less than 1,500 delegates attended the congress.

African King Returns Home

KAMPALA, Uganda (AP) — King Freddie, the 31-year-old Kabaka of Buganda, returned home to a tumultuous welcome Monday after two years' exile in Britain.

Thousands of Africans roared out their tribal victory cry as the dapper young monarch stepped from a plane at Entebbe Airport.

The cheering was redoubled when 24-year-old Queen Nabagerika, who had kept the home fires burning, greeted her returning lord.

The Cambridge-educated Kabaka, Frederick Mutesa II, was exiled in 1953 when he opposed Britain's plans to federate his kingdom more closely with the three other provinces of the Uganda protectorate.

He was allowed to return under a new agreement which leaves him with fewer powers and puts more responsibility on the Luki-
