

State's Newest Game Bird Brings Warning

(Editor's Note: This is the second of two articles describing Oregon's upland game birds, their origin, living habits, plumage and coloring. The season opens Saturday.)

PORTLAND (AP) — Oregon's newest game bird is the chukar partridge, a native of Asia, and game officials warn hunters not to confuse it with the Hungarian partridge when they take to the woods and hills this weekend.

Hunters will do well to heed the warning since there is no open season on chukar partridge, which was introduced in Oregon in 1951. The chukar is similar in color to the Hungarian partridge, but is larger.

Since 1951 some 45,000 chukars have been released in the eastern part of the state from game farms and McKean said it's "difficult to say" what the total population is now.

They have taken hold well, however, and there's a possibility the first open season on them may be held next year, according to McKean.

GRAY PLUMAGE

The chukar, which likes to live in deep, dry, rocky areas, has gray plumage with a black circle around the throat and eyes. The sides are barred with eight or nine black stripes. The birds average about 20 ounces in weight and some consider them the best eating of all game birds.

UO Students Held After Field Burning

CORVALLIS (AP) — Twelve-foot University of Oregon letters are burned in the turf of Oregon State College's football field and six University students are in custody for it.

Dick Adams, head of maintenance at OSC, said it seemed likely that the letters "U O" will be clearly visible when Washington State College plays here Saturday in the Oregon State homecoming game.

The letters were burned in with gasoline and set fire shortly after 3 a. m. Tuesday.

The same letters were painted on the walk near the Memorial Union, but were quickly washed off.

Samuel G. Whitney Jr., a sophomore from Portland, said he and the others, all freshmen, burned the letters as a prank under needling of upperclassmen.

He said they all thought the worst that could happen to them if caught was to have their heads shaved. That happened to some students last year. But Dan Poling, OSC dean of men, said the two institutions have an agreement that in the event of vandalism, the guilty students will be expelled.

The students from the university were booked into jail on a charge of destruction of state property. Formal complaint was being drawn up.

Whitney was released on \$50 bail which he provided. None of the others had any identification or other effects with them and were unable to provide early bail.

They identified themselves as: Gary V. Callahan, 18, Milwaukie; Michael Bird, 17, Astoria; Charles E. Klingforth, 18, Portland; Gary T. Hubbard, 18, Oakland, Ore.; and Lawrence E. Mullerkey, 18, Glendale.

Whitney said none of his group painted the letters. He said he understood two other carloads of students were involved in that. They apparently got away unnoticed.

Those arrested were stopped by campus police then turned over to city police.

Sale Of Seals To Hank Greenberg Said 'In Bag'

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — A deal by Hank Greenberg, general manager of the Cleveland Indians, to buy the San Francisco Seals baseball club appeared in the bag Wednesday.

"We have reached a verbal agreement on the sale," said Greenberg Tuesday night after conferring with Damon Miller, president of the Little Corp., controlling the Seals franchise in the Pacific Coast League.

Miller, who struggled with slumping attendance and growing debts all last season, broke into a big grin.

"I've gone over all the books, but there are still people and things I want to know before coming to a definite decision," Greenberg said. "If all turns out as expected, Greenberg said he would make a press conference announcement Wednesday."

The offer made to Greenberg, Miller said, would be a \$100,000 deal.

"Hank would have to assume a \$50,000 bank note, pay off \$30,000 still owed the Pacific Coast League, and purchase 100 per cent of the common stock, which is worth \$20,000," Miller said.

Greenberg said he would protect preferred stockholders in the Little Corp., organized two years ago to keep San Francisco in organized baseball. "I have no intention of freezing them out."

Greenberg said he expected to be president of the Seals club. But would remain in Cleveland with the American League club.

"The important thing is to get players. I think I could better serve the Seals by remaining in Cleveland," Greenberg said.

"But the big wheel would be the man I place here to run the club."
