## Hurricane Katie Runs Out Of Wind

MIAMI, Fla. (AP)—Hurricane Katie ran out of wind far out in the Atlantic today and spread out into an area of squalls.

The season's 11th tropical storm was last reported about 330 miles south-southwest of Bermuda and 800 miles east of the Florida coast. It was spinning north-northeast at about 21 m.p.h., but had winds of only 40 miles an hour.

"As the storm continues to lose its tropical characteristics there will be some spreading out and distortion of the circular wind pattern but with no increase in winds," said the Miami Weather Bureau.

Few tropical storms develop after Oct. 15 and forecasters believe Katie might well be the last of the 1955 season.
