Fort Rock Line Finished

FORT ROCK — With the completion of 150 miles of power line in north Lake County Basin, the Northern Construction Company, of Terry, Montana, has contracted to build an additional 35 1/2 miles of distribution line for Midstate Electric Cooperative. Cost of the additional system of power lines will be approximately \$75,000. This construction will serve the area known as Sink as well as several short connections. Work is expected to start on November 1. C. W. Brown, contractor in partnership with John A. Unfred, and Mrs. Brown are in Montana at the present time where Brown is attending to ranch business at Terry and Mrs. Brown is visiting her mother at Miles City. Unfred has remained at Fort Rock for the wind-up of the big job and start of the addition.
