The bride is an alumna of Willamette University and Los Angeles City College. Her husband is a graduate of local schools and is stationed at Castle Air Force Base near Merced.



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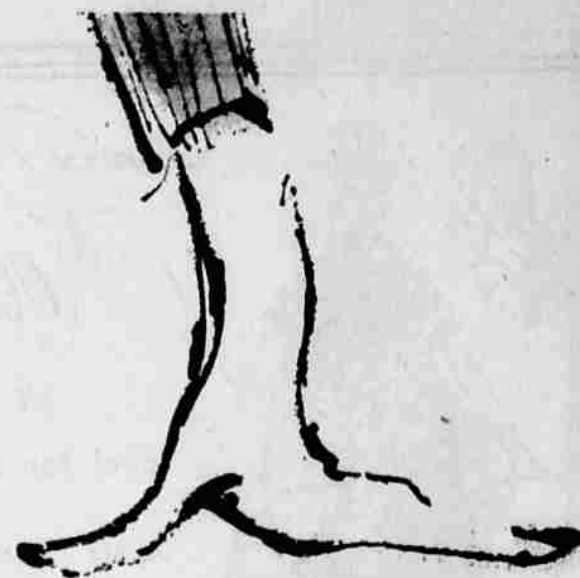
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
