

Pirates Continue To Pace Prep Grid Vote

Oregon high school football teams will head into a crucial round of play this coming weekend with Marshfield again ruling the roost.

For the third consecutive time Marshfield was the unanimous choice of sports writers and broadcasters taking part in the weekly Associated Press poll. Marshfield added to its unbeaten string of games by downing highly regarded Eugene, 32-13, last week.

Gresham again was in the No. 2 position, after scoring its seventh consecutive win with a 35-20 decision over North Salem.

After that came Corvallis, Pendleton, Jefferson of Portland, Hillsboro, Vale, Prineville, South Salem and Cottage Grove.

Larry Doby Key In Sox, Tribe Trade

CHICAGO (AP) — Slugger-hunting Frank Lane is gone, but the Chicago White Sox finally may have nabbed their long-sought cleanup batter in outfielder Larry Doby of the Cleveland Indians.

Late yesterday, they traded slumping shortstop Chico Carrasquel and light-hitting outfielder Jim Busby for Doby in a straight player deal.

Doby, 30, a long-ball swatter with a .291 average last season, was coveted by Lane long before the trade-minded general manager moved to the St. Louis Cardinals. It was Sox Vice President Chuck Comiskey who finally landed him.

The Sox finished third in the American League race for the past four seasons. Conceding such problems as pitching and infield weaknesses, the big bang for the Sox was lack of a fencebuster.

Doby should be the cleanup man missed since big Gus Zernial was traded away in 1951.

Doby, with a lifetime major league batting mark of .286 in eight seasons, last season slammed 26 homers, 17 doubles and 5 triples, driving across 75 runs. This was all despite an ailing wrist.

In New Orleans, Doby learned of the trade, and said: "I have enjoyed every year playing for Cleveland. It is a wonderful organization. I hope I can fill the bill for Chicago and I think I can."

The departure of Carrasquel, who batted .256 and drove across 52 runs last season, was no surprise. Once regarded as "another (Phil) Rizzuto," the man from Venezuela was a hot-and-cold player. Chico, who is 27, probably will be replaced by rookie Luis Aparicio from Memphis, although Jim Bredeweser and hustling Carl Peterson will push him.

Busby batted .239 last season.

SEATTLE (AP) — Floored three times in the early rounds, Dixon Hoxsey, 142, Seattle, hit the canvas twice in the ninth Tuesday night to take his second beating from the mitts of Buddy McDonald, 143½, sharpshooting welterweight from Edmondson, Ala.

The referee counted Hoxsey out at 2:48 of the ninth round of the scheduled 10-rounder. McDonald had dropped the Seattle welter in the first, fifth, and seventh rounds before applying the finisher—a right counter to the jaw.

SYDNEY, Australia (AP) — Jack Kramer arrived here today to dangle his bag of gold personally under the noses of Lew Hoad and Ken Rosewall amid increasing hints that the two young Aussies may join his professional tennis tour.

"If Kramer has a new offer, I'll give him a good hearing," said Hoad. "I almost accepted his first offer."

Hoad and Rosewall, the 20-year-olds who won back the coveted Davis Cup for Australia this year, rejected Kramer's pro offer less than two weeks ago. They said they would work for Australian sporting goods companies and continue to play amateur tennis.

Now apparently, they're wavering.

Only a few days before he received their refusals to team up with him, Kramer had signed American ace Tony Trabert for an estimated \$75,000. Without Hoad and Rosewall in the fold, the tour would not pack much glamor.

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Bosley Lineman Of Week

Bruce Bosley, West Virginia tackle once described by his coach, Art Lewis, as "the man I'd most hate to meet in a dark alley," was selected Wednesday as The Associated Press Lineman of the Week.

Bosley, a 235-pound senior from Greenbank, W.Va., earned the award for his superb play last Saturday that helped the 7th-ranked Mountaineers overpower an inspired Penn State aggregation 21-7.

Big Bruce played a tremendous game in the second half as the Mountaineers came from behind to beat the Nittany Lions. He was constantly breaking through and dumping State's backs for losses.

Other tackles were prominent among the linemen nominated in the weekly Associated Press poll of sportswriters and broadcasters.

John Linnemann of Marquette made 17 tackles and two assists as the Warriors held Boston College to a 12-13 tie. He blocked the conversion attempt that would have given B.C. victory.

Tom Powell of Colgate led the line play that gave Colgate a 7-0 upset victory over Yale. Charlie Gibbons did the same for Rhode Island as the Rhodians surprised Brown, 19-7. Fred Robinson of Washington played a big game in a 7-7 tie with Stanford and Bob Pollock of Pitt was equally effective as the Panthers upset Duke 26-7.
