Flood waters closed Mount Rainier National Park today and covered 2000 acres of low-lying farmlands in the state of Washington.

Meanwhile, cool air rolled over the Great Plains with winds up to 45 miles per hour and Indian summer held sway in the East.

The Washington floods poured from a rip in a 150 foot dike in a freshwater slough near Mount Vernon. Crop damage was estimated in the thousands of dollars, but the flood danger appeared to be easing today.

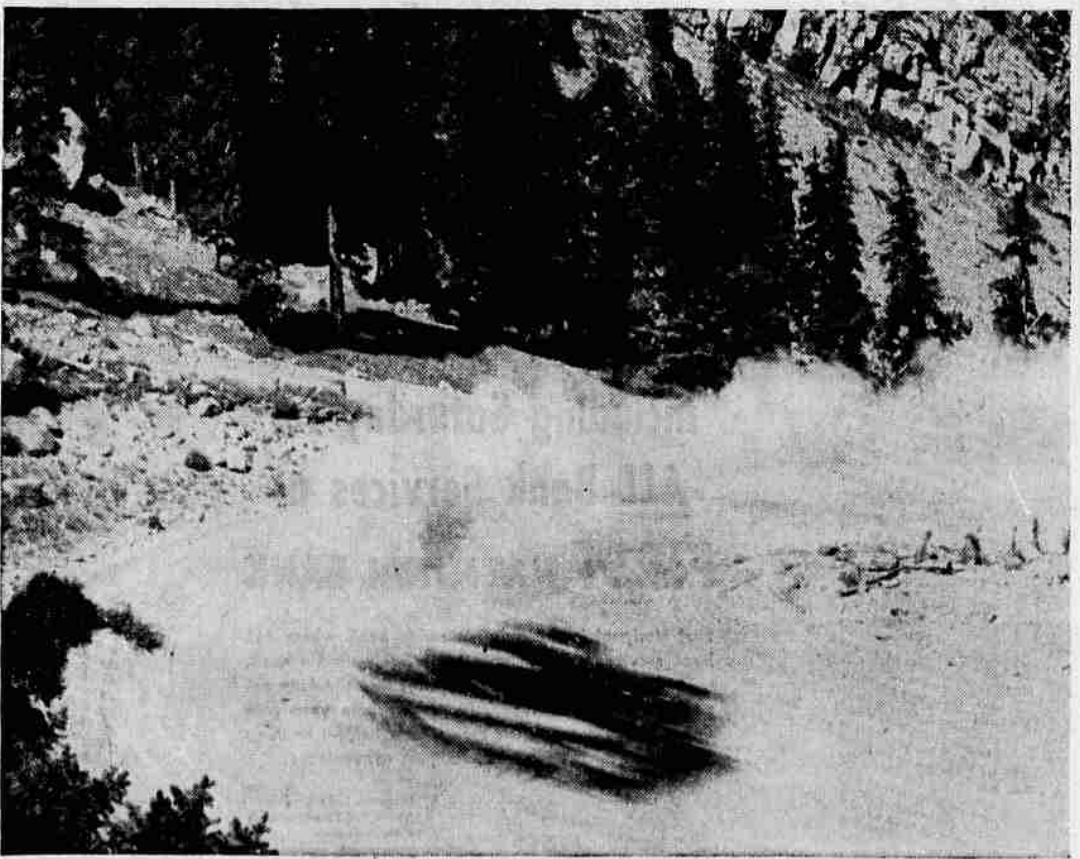
