WALL STREET NEW YORK — The stock market moved to an irregular close Friday in a session that found prices mixed at the start, down at midday, and up in the final stretch.

There was no emphasis on either the buying or selling side as the market moved along a relatively narrow range. Prices changed around 2 points either way at the outside.

Trading amounted to an estimated 1,800,000 shares for the day. That compares with 1,630,000 shares traded Thursday.
