Terps Overpower So. Carolina; Tulane Upsets Favored Auburn

COLLEGE PARK, Md. (AP) — First-ranked Maryland, with steady Ed Vereb's three touchdowns setting the pace, jumped to a 27-0 football victory over South Carolina.

Vereb, 185-pound halfback, put the awesome Terrapins ahead early by carrying for all but 10 yards of a 59-yard drive and scoring from three yards out.

With this touchdown he tied the old Atlantic Coast Conference individual scoring record of 54 points and his two later touchdowns set a new record of 66 points, which he has on 11 TDs.

The victory could have been a big step toward the Orange Bowl on New Year's Day.

The win was the 12th straight for the Terps.

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — Magnificent Oene Newton threw two touchdowns passes Saturday in guiding Tulane to a 27-13 upset victory over Auburn, the nation's eighth ranked football power.

Newton kept Tulane spirits soaring and his fired-up mates allowed Auburn to cross mid-field only once before the final period. He got Tulane off to a running start late in the opening quarter with a three-yard touchdown pitch to end Bill Bullon.

MILWAUKEE (AP) — Freddy Wyatt, West Virginia's little quarterback, sparked the Mountaineers to their sixth straight victory of the 1955 football season Saturday with a 29-0 rout of Marquette University.

The stumbling Warriors were powerless against the drive of the Mountaineers, ranked seventh nationally in the weekly AP poll.

ATLANTA (AP) — The flashing legs of George Volkert led Georgia Tech to two quick touchdowns against a sluggish Duke football team Saturday and the bowl-hopeful Engineers went on to whip the Blue Devils 37-0.

Volkert, a 184-pound halfback, set up Tech's first score on an 18-yard end sweep and scored the second on a 22-yard wide run.

ATHENS, Ga. (AP) — Quarterback Jimmy Harper came off the bench Saturday, found a bulldozing ball carrier in sophomore Henry Henson and guided Georgia to a 35-14 football triumph over winless Alabama.

Harper's magic helped Georgia stretch Alabama's victory drought to 12 games and gave Georgia its second Southeastern Conference victory and its fourth success in seven games.

Rooks Topple Oregon Frosh

EUGENE (AP) — The Oregon State Rooks, paced by halfback Paul Lowe who made two touchdowns runs, defeated the Oregon Frosh 26-7 in Friday's football game here.

One of Lowe's runs was for 95 yards. He went 86 on his other scoring play.

Another Rook touchdown came after guard Seraphin Sanchez blocked a punt by Herb Juran, Oregon quarterback from South Salem. The Rooks recovered on the Oregon 16 and scored three plays later with halfback Earl Darden going the final two yards.

Both Lowe and Darden are from Los Angeles.

Oregon State scored again on an 11-yard pass from Tony Arana of Vale to Darden.

Fullback Don Laundisler, from Gresham, scored Oregon's lone touchdown on a one-yard plunge in the third period.

Oregon had the ball inside the Oregon State 10-yard line in the final seconds of the game, but the attack was halted.

The Oregon Frosh, who tied the Rooks 7-7 at Corvallis a week ago, meet the Washington State Frosh at Pendleton next weekend.

Texas Longhorns Tip SMU; TC, 'Backs Win

DALLAS, Texas (AP) — Texas rode with Walt Frazier, Joe Clements and a roughhouse line to a 19-18 victory over Southern Methodist Saturday to knock the Methodists out of a first place tie in the Southwest Conference football race.

In one of the wildest offensive games this storied series has known, the Longhorns barely edged through on the toe of Joe Youngblood and an iron-bound defense.

That defense stymied every wild charge of an SMU team that camped in Texas territory the entire last period, twice getting close enough to try field goals.

Frazier, the versatile sophomore, passed for one touchdown, caught a pass for another, hammered the SMU line, kicked beautifully and all-in-all was the big man in Texas' supreme effort.

Texas A&M was tied by Arkansas 7-7 Saturday and that left the Aggies only a half-game ahead

of Texas, Texas Christian and Southern Methodist.

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. (AP) — The Arkansas Razorbacks, out-gunned for three quarters, came back with a 79-yard drive in the last five minutes to tie the favored Texas A&M Aggies 7-7 before a homecoming crowd of 27,000 Saturday.

Texas A&M, which had won five straight before this game, scored on a 59-yard march just after the half. They penetrated inside the Arkansas 20 on four other occasions.

But the Aggies couldn't get the extra touchdown they needed to keep their Southwest Conference record clean. A&M has won four conference games against no defeats.

Arkansas' big play was a pass from quarterback George Walker to Preston Carpenter which covered 23 yards and set up the tying touchdown on the Aggie four.

WACO, Tex. (AP) — Flashy James Swank led Texas Christian to an impressive 24-0 victory over Baylor's discipline-riddled Bears Saturday, virtually rolling the Bruins out of the Southwest Conference race.

Apparently Baylor's loss of three key linemen last week for training injuries had little to do with the beating they took from the bruising Frogs before 34,000.

Swank set an all-time scoring record for one season for TCU when his fourth period 69-yard gallop for a touchdown brought his total for the season to 81 points—better than Cy Leland's 79 in 1929.

The other teams among the top 10 in the Associated Press high school football poll came through as expected. Marshall, No. 1, rolled over Pineville, the eighth place team, 21-0.

Second-ranked Gresham became the district 3-A-1 champion with a 12-7 victory over Central Catholic of Portland, Ore., No. 3.

Cinched at least a tie for the 8-A-1 title with a 9-0 victory over South Salem, No. 9.

Fourth-ranked Pendleton crushed Baker, 45-7, to gain at least a tie for the 7-A-1 title. Jefferson of Portland, No. 5, which last week clinched the district 1 championship, barely got by Benson, 13-12.

Seventh ranked Vale, one of the A-2 powers, warmed up for next week's 7-A-2 championship battle with Ontario by beating Nyssa, 48-0. Ontario had an equally easy time with Payette, Idaho, 50-19.

College Grove, No. 10, was idle. Washington of Portland, which last week sewed up the district 2-A-1 crown, was upset by Franklin, 18-0. Cleveland defeated Grant, 20-6 and Lincoln beat Roosevelt 15-0.

In district 6-A-1 action, Medford rolled over Ashland 40-7 and Grants Pass beat Klamath Falls 33-25 in a protested game.

Unranked Albany remained in the running for the 8-A-1 title with a 28-7 victory over North Salem. In district 5-A-1, Eugene beat North Bend, 27-6, and Roseburg downed Springfield, 19-7.

Dallas captured the 4-A-2 championship with a 33-0 win over Modesto, and Junction City is assured at least a tie for the 3-A-2 title after whipping Willamette of Eugene, 20-0.

In other A-2 action, previously unbeaten St. Helens was upset by Seaside 14-6 in a game that had no bearing on district standing.

Sheridan remained unbeaten in 3-A-2 play with a 45-12 victory over Banks.

Slade, unranked in the heavy-weight division, punched his way to a split, 10-round decision over third-ranked Jackson Friday night in one of the year's greatest upsets.

It was Slade's second victory in three meetings with the Far Rockaway, N.Y., contender. He also outpointed Jackson in a New York bout in April, 1954, and then dropped a decision to his in-and-out rival last spring.

In Friday night's "rubber match," Slade once again called on his greater ring experience to outmaster Jackson's brute strength and whirlwind tactics. There were no knockdowns, but Slade was crotchety and bleeding from the nose at the finish.

Referee Tony LaBranche cast the deciding vote in Slade's favor. He gave Jimmy 98 points and awarded Jackson 94 under Ohio's 10-point "must" scoring system.

Judge Charlie Bill also favored Slade, 96-93, while Judge Herb Williams voted for Jackson, 96-95.

Slade piled up his important points during the early rounds, tired slightly in the middle rounds and then had to overcome a strong late rally by Jackson, who probably sensed he needed a knock out to win.

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Kramer Urges US To Check Aussie Netters

SYDNEY, Australia (UPI)—Jack Kramer, weary and disgusted after his failure to sign Australia's Lew Hoad and Ken Rosewall to professional tennis contracts, said today he would be disappointed if U.S. tennis officials "don't probe this one."

"I wouldn't say I've been double-crossed, but, brother, Hoad and Rosewall certainly changed their attitude since I last saw them," Kramer said before leaving for San Francisco by plane.

When he signed Tony Trabert of Cincinnati, O., for \$75,000 several

weeks ago, Kramer believed he also had Hoad and Rosewall lined up for his professional tour. The 20-year-old Aussies decided to remain amateurs after receiving attractive, long-range proposals from the sporting goods firms which employ them.

SEES PROBE
Rosewall refused to talk to Kramer when he came here this week in a last-ditch effort to sign the two Davis Cup stars. Kramer looked drawn and weary after three days of futile negotiations with Hoad.

"If people figure Trabert's a professional, these kids are gone for sure," Kramer said. "Trabert hasn't even signed with me yet. I'll be disappointed if U.S. tennis officials don't probe this one."

Hoad turned Kramer down yesterday although Kramer said he had boosted his original offer of 20,000 Australian pounds (\$45,000) to \$67,500.

Mrs. Harold Stahley, Hoad's mother-in-law, said tonight in Melbourne that the Los Angeles promoter's final bid was \$70,000 and that Frank Sedgman, former Aussie Davis Cup star, who has signed to tour again with Kramer, also tried to get Hoad to turn pro.

AGAINST IT
Kramer's final offer was the sum Hoad had set as the price needed for his signature after Kramer announced he would make a last-minute bid to sign the Aussie players. But Hoad's 21-year-old wife Jennifer, who is expecting their first child, turned the tide against the U.S. promoter.

"Jenny doesn't want me to sign," Hoad said although he admitted he wanted to accept Kramer's offer.

No Australian amateur tennis officials welcomed or said goodbye to Kramer. They heaved a sigh of relief when Hoad, obeying his wife, finally refused to sign with the crew-cut Yank.

"The funny thing is that Hoad approached me first," Kramer said as he prepared to leave. "I'll be 1988 before I can make him another offer. He really missed the boat. But, as I said yesterday, I'll never again underestimate the power of a woman."
