New Execution Date Ordered
SAN FRANCISCO (UP) — The state Supreme Court has ordered the Siskiyou Superior Court to set a new execution date for Henry Thomas, convicted murderer of Mrs. Velsie Ainsworth in Tule Lake five years ago.
Thomas, 33-year-old farm worker, was sentenced to death after he pleaded guilty to killing Mrs. Ainsworth during a robbery of her grocery Oct. 29, 1950. An accomplice who pleaded not guilty and was convicted was given a life sentence.

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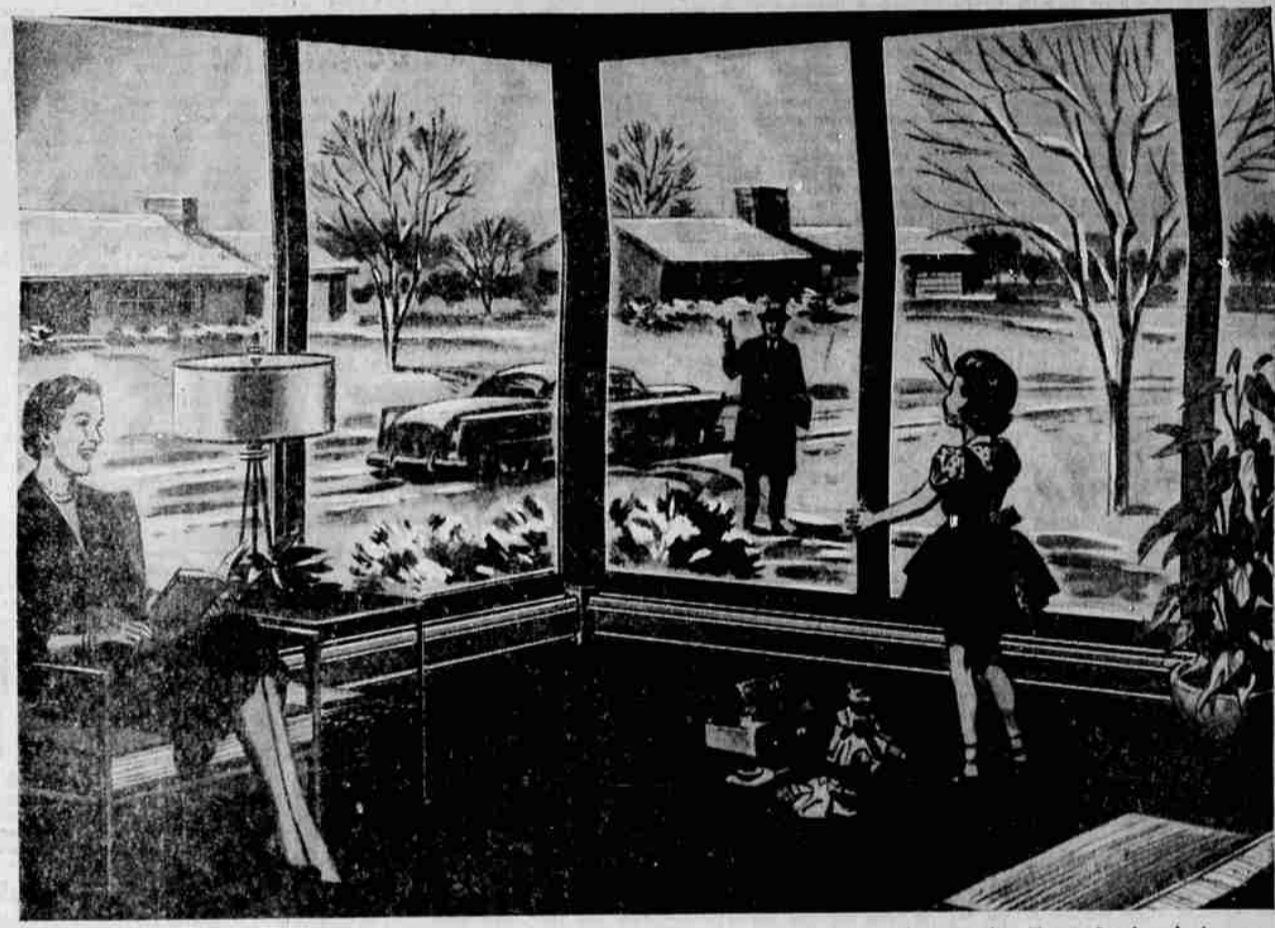
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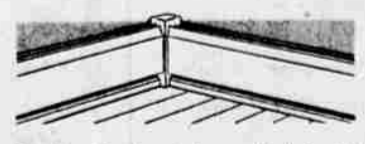
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
