

Knowland Calls On Ike To Announce Political Plans, Give Others Try

WASHINGTON (UP)—Sen. Republican Leader William W. Knowland suggested today that President Eisenhower should make an early announcement of his 1956 political plans.

California Weather Fair

SAN FRANCISCO (UP)—The California weather summary for the week ending Oct. 30 shows a fair to good weather over California last night and this morning. The clouds in the north end of the state which produced 97 or an inch of rain at Eureka disappeared last evening. Temperatures were lower in Northern California and near the central coast yesterday and were a little higher in the Owens Valley and Mojave Desert. Eureka reported 54, Red Bluff 72, Sacramento 80, Los Angeles 97 and El Centro 91. Temperatures were in the 40s this morning and as low as 29 in Salinas and 24 in Mt. Shasta.

Inyo had a strong wind all night and the mercury did not fall below 67. A small storm is charted near Vancouver Island this morning and it is moving rapidly southward. The southern portion of this disturbance is expected to cause showers from around Ukiah and Redding northward today and some in the high Sierras. The storm is expected to bring rain to the Sacramento Valley and the Klamath Basin. The temperature trend can be expected to be most of California.

"Until the President gets out of the hospital and discloses his plans," he told reporters, "I cannot say any discussion of individual candidates is premature."

Knowland did make clear that he thinks any retirement announcement from Mr. Eisenhower should come by late fall or early winter. The deadlines for candidates to enter presidential primaries in some of the states come early in February.

If Mr. Eisenhower should withdraw, Knowland's home state may provide much pulling and hauling because it is also the home of Vice President Richard M. Nixon, another possible contender. Gov. Goodwin J. Knight and Chief Justice Earl Warren.

On the other side of the political fence, Sen. Paul H. Douglas (D-Ill.) told reporters today that Republicans "ought to be indicted for murder in the first degree" if they force Mr. Eisenhower to seek a second term.

Douglas also showed no enthusiasm for the line being taken by some Southern Democrats who are calling for a "middle-of-the-road" platform and presidential candidate.

Another Democrat, Gov. George M. Leader of Pennsylvania predicted that his state's delegation to the Democratic national convention next August will be almost solid for Adlai E. Stevenson.

Leader said he has taken "no formal position" regarding any candidate for the Democratic presidential nomination. But he declared that he believes Stevenson is "the right man in the right place."

Stevenson has not said yet whether he is a candidate for the nomination.

At Duluth, Minn., Sunday, he refused to give a flat "yes" or "no" to a resolution urging him to enter the Minnesota Presidential primary next March 20. The resolution was adopted unanimously by the state committee of the Minnesota Democratic Party.

Stevenson said that he plans to make known his intentions in Chicago.
