Crew Ends Timber Cut

ALTURAS - Cutting operations at the Cottonwood Creek sale area were completed last week by the Loveness Logging Company, approximately six million board feet of timber were removed during the summer.

Logging operations have shifted to the Hunsinger Flat area where two million feet will be cut this year. This will complete the annual allowable cut of eight million feet from the Big Valley unit.

Activity in the Big Valley unit has been cut, the initial sustained yield cycle will have been completed with removal of all unharmed trees. As a result of proper cutting, the second cycle will start for the unit. Cutting will be simplified when the basic rest system is established.
