12 States Slate Vote Today

WASHINGTON (AP) — Voters in 12 states ballot Tuesday in off-year state or local elections. The results promise little in the way of national significance since most campaigns have been local and no congressional seats are being filled. The featured contests are for governor of Kentucky and mayor of Philadelphia. Most political observers forecast Democratic victories. Both posts now are held by Democrats. State legislatures will be elected in Kentucky, New Jersey and Virginia. Mississippi is the only other state electing a governor but the winner of the Democratic primary, Atty. Gen. J. P. Coleman, is unopposed.

Eden Proposes Conference To Study Security Cases

LONDON (AP) — Prime Minister Eden proposes a bipartisan conference of eminent Britons to study "further precautions" to prevent any recurrence of the Burgess-Maclean Red spying case. Eden told the House of Commons last night the Foreign Office has adopted "correct and careful security measures" for the future. But he added his government would like the bipartisan conference to explore "whether any further precautions can properly be taken to reduce the risk of treachery."

He suggested the conference be composed of privy councillors represented by both his Conservative party and the opposition Labourites. The Privy Council consists of national leaders whose normal duty is to advise the Queen. Cabinet members must be privy councillors and generally form the acting council. But there are many other members including former Cabinet ministers and leaders in various fields who can be called upon when their advice is required. Two former prime ministers — Conservative Sir Winston Churchill and Laborite Clement Attlee — are members.

The searching examination of security measures resulted from the activities of two renegade diplomats, Donald Maclean and Guy Burgess, who fled Britain in 1951. They are believed to be in Russia or elsewhere behind the Iron Curtain.

Vladimir Petrov, a former Soviet diplomat who defected to the West in Australia, said recently Maclean and Burgess had been recruited as Communist agents in the 1930s.

British newspapers grumbled today because the speeches by Eden and Foreign Secretary Harold Macmillan did not dispel the mystery of a "third man" in the foreign service who may have tipped off Burgess and Maclean that they were under investigation. Macmillan said a search for a possible third man is still proceeding. The Conservative Daily Sketch said that Eden's plan "certainly won't satisfy anyone that the third man who tipped off Maclean in 1951 isn't still in the Foreign Office."

Referring to the criticism of the way the Burgess-Maclean case has been handled, Eden, a Foreign Office veteran and twice foreign minister, told Commons: "This has been a sad day for the foreign service because the reputation of the foreign service is part of our national reputation."

But he insisted that up to the time Burgess and Maclean skipped the country, investigations by security officers had failed to turn up evidence of treachery which would have justified the arrest of either man.

City elections, many of them non-partisan are being held in Boston, Cleveland, Indianapolis and dozens of smaller cities in Arkansas, Connecticut, Indiana, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Utah and Wyoming.

Referendums of national interest are on the ballots in two states. Ohioans will vote on a proposal that would meet the main condition of auto industry agreements for a supplemental layoff pay plan. And Kentucky will decide whether to lower the minimum voting age from 21 to 18.

In the contest for governor of Kentucky, A. B. Chandler is attempting a political comeback. The Republican-opponent of the former governor, senator and baseball commissioner is Edwin R. Denney, former U. S. district attorney. The choice for mayor of Philadelphia is between veteran Democratic campaigner Richardson Dilworth and Republican W. Thacher Longstreth, 35-year-old advertising executive. Democrats won the post in 1951, ending 67 years of Republican rule.

The referendum proposal in Ohio would permit payment of state unemployment compensation to jobless workers receiving layoff pay from their employers.

Since some states do not permit such dual payments, the auto industry agreements won't be effective until such payments have approval in states in which two-thirds of a company's employees work. If Ohio voters add their approval to that already given in some states, this condition will have been met.
