Oregon Young GOP To Meet

Governor Paul Patterson will be the principal banquet speaker for the Young Republican state convention at the Hotel Benson in Portland November 11-13, according to Kenneth Maher, chairman of the event.

Registration for the convention will begin at 3 p.m. November 11, with a reception for Republican leaders of the state from 5 to 7 p.m.

Friday evening and Saturday morning will be devoted to committee meetings.

Sig Unander, state treasurer, will be the principal speaker at a luncheon meeting at 11:30 a.m. Saturday, November 12. He will be introduced by State Representative Robert J. Jensen.

The business session, beginning at 2 p.m., will be broadcast by station KWWJ, with Don Kneass as the announcer.

Tom Lawson McCall will introduce Governor Patterson at the banquet and the program will be followed by a dance at the Benson Hotel.

Sunday morning there will be organized church attendance at the First Congregational Church and a breakfast meeting of the new executive committee.

Most prominently mentioned candidates for state president are Jim Hatfield, Salem and Dave Belch and Lou O'Donnell both of Portland.

CofC Elects New Directors

Five directors of the Klamath County Chamber of Commerce were elected for three-year terms by the vote of the members recently. Announcement of their election was made by Bert Hall at the forum on sanitation held by the chamber in the Wisena Hotel Wednesday noon.

Three of the directors are newly elected. Dick Gallagher of the industrial development committee, Bob Mead, tourist and conventions, and Grant Cosgrove, membership committee.

Harry Molstere and Karl Dehlinger were reelected to their posts. They were eligible for reelection because they have served as replacements for directors resigned. Normally a director may only serve for a three-year term.

Dehlinger is on the agricultural committee and Molstere, tourists and conventions.

BUCK PASSING

DENVER (AP) — Colorado's attorney general was called upon yesterday to settle this problem: Does the mayor or city clerk of Frederick (pop. 599) have the right to open the mail? Clerk Ira N. Thompson advised the state official that "the new mayor" — whom he did not further identify — had been opening letters addressed to the town, whereas previously the clerk had done it. Atty. Gen. Duke W. Dunbar consulted lawbooks, found nothing helpful, and said it is up to the town trustee to decide.

SHORTHAND REPORTER

DENVER (AP) — A person who wears a face mask with a mouthpiece and dictates through it a transcript of events onto a wire recorder is no shorthand reporter, says Atty. Gen. Duke W. Dunbar. He gave the opinion in a ruling yesterday to Harold E. Hastings, secretary-treasurer of the Colorado Board of Shorthand Reporters. Hastings said two applicants had applied to take an examination for certified shorthand reporter using the device.

Ninth Seasonal Hunter Dies

LEBANON, Ore. (AP) — Ronald Jensen, 14, of Lebanon became Oregon's ninth hunting season gun shot fatality when he died in a hospital Wednesday.

He and two companions, Kenneth Coleman and Ronald Mats, had returned to Coleman's home after a bird hunting trip. Mats was lifting Coleman's shotgun out of the car when it accidentally discharged, police reported. Jensen was wounded in the side and back. He died a few hours later at a Lebanon hospital.

Jensen was the fourth shooting fatality of the bird hunting season. Five others died in deer and elk hunting shooting accidents. At least 19 other hunters suffered non-fatal wounds since Oregon's hunting season opened Oct. 1.

Moroccans Keep Up Terrorism

RABAT, French Morocco, (AP) — Shootings, bombings and burnings have increased in Morocco in recent days despite the scheduled return of Sultan Mohammed Ben Youssef as demanded by Moroccan nationalists.

Four persons were reported killed and two injured in Casablanca Wednesday in six incidents in the native quarter. Two homemade hand grenades were thrown in the outskirts of violence there.

Official figures covering the first seven days of November showed one European and 27 Moroccans killed and 52 Moroccans and 6 Europeans wounded.

Twenty-three bombs or grenades were set off and 21 fires were started by terrorists in that period.

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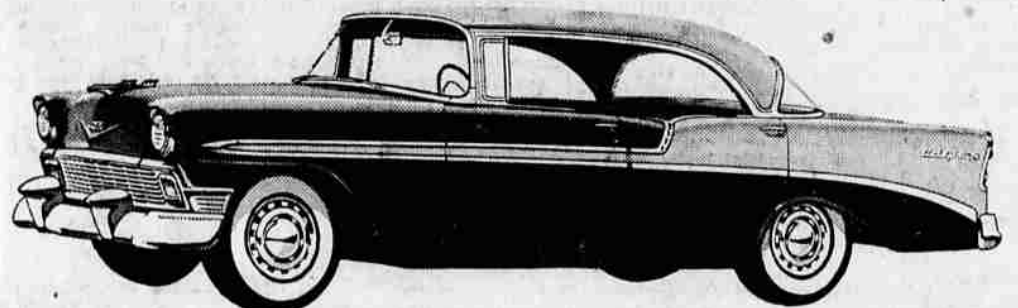
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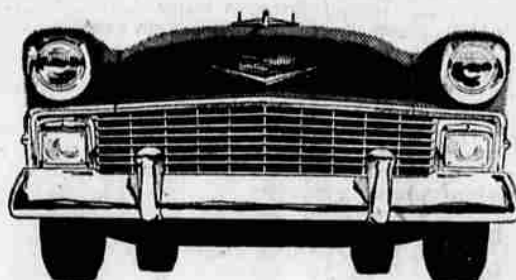
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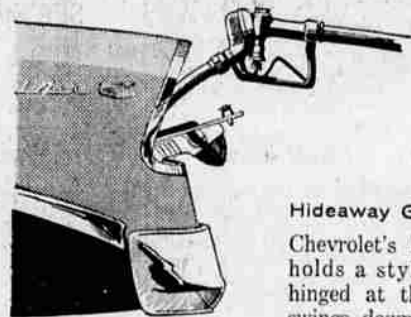
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
