## Pinay To Seek Settlement Of Saar Issue In Germany

GENEVA (AP)—French Foreign Minister Antoine Pinay goes to Germany this weekend in quest of a new settlement of the Saar issue which could open the gates to a new campaign for German-French unity.

Significantly, Pinay's visit comes on the heels of Soviet Foreign Minister V. M. Molotov's blast at German reunification at the foreign ministers' Big Four conference here.

The dispute over the Saar has repeatedly poisoned relations between Paris and Bonn, and blocked any real progress toward a broad-

## Military Lists 'Sage' Deaths

FORT POLK, La. (AP)—Army officials today blamed an overabundance of non-combat accidents for boosting the death toll to 19 during preliminary maneuvers for "Operation Sagebrush."

More than half the victims died off limits or while on leave, the Army said.

The mock combat phase of the largest peacetime maneuvers since World War II was not slated to begin until next Tuesday. All of the soldiers killed so far have died during the preparation period for the war games.

An Army spokesman said 12 of the soldiers killed died in automobile accidents and seven of these happened among soldiers on leave.

Two men were killed in a helicopter crash. Two drowned off limits, one was struck by lightning, one was crushed to death by a rock lift and one died in an automobile accident while traveling to report for duty.

The latest victim was Pfc. Peter F. Magnier, 23, who was killed when a tank rammed into a jeep in which he was riding.

Military officials said the number of private vehicle accidents admittedly was high.

The two drowning victims were members of an engineering unit constructing and repairing bridges. They were drowned when they were swimming in an off limits section on the Red River.

Some 140,000 troops and airmen will participate in the war games when they begin in earnest. The exercise involves the use of the latest atomic and electronic weapons in which "aggressor" forces have invaded and secured a foothold in the U.S. gulf coast area.

The mock combats will take place over more than six million acres of western Louisiana.

## June Allyson, Hubby Team Up For New Musical Movie

HOLLYWOOD (UP)—June Allyson sighed today that her name will be in the gossip columns again, this time for "flirting with my director."

The scandal magazines, however, need not reach for their big-size type. June went to work this week for the first time under the eye of her director husband, Dick Powell, when cameras rolled on the musical version of "It Happened One Night."

"I'll get in all the scandal columns," grinned June. "Actually I wanted to team with my husband because he has a lot of talent and I can benefit by it."

The actress and Powell wanted to work together, and he eyed the opportunity when he signed at Columbia Pictures and remembered the studio's 1933 classic, "It Happened One Night."

Powell cast his wife in the Claudette Colbert role and Jack Lemmon was given Clark Gable's part.

The turning of the cameras on the re-make of the famous comedy proved a notable event at Columbia Studio.

Director Frank Capra's 1933 version was a \$300,000 small screen black-and-white stepchild that proved to be a "sleeper." It swept the Oscar slate and went down as an all-time great.

Capra was invited to the set to direct Powell, a newcomer to director's ranks, try and repeat the early success in CinemaScope, color, fancy sound and a \$2,100,000 budget.

Powell was directing a musical

number of the famous haystack scene in which Gable tried to find a place for Miss Colbert to sleep.

"It Happened One Night" also will feature musical numbers based on the well-remembered hitchhiking and blanket-hanging scenes.

"I wanted to get Gable and Claudette to pull up in a Thunderbird when June is hitchhiking but Gable's agents said no," Powell said.

Capra reminisced that nobody thought his movie would be good. "We couldn't sell the female role to anyone," he said. "Nobody wanted it because it was a stooge part."

He thought a moment and added, "I wonder about these remakes. I'd be afraid to try it."

## Scoter Taken Near Lake

Rare, indeed, was the bird in the bag of a waterfowl hunter at Summer Lake.

Stymied at the strange appearance of the brownish colored duck he had shot and thinking it was some kind of black duck, the hunter brought the bird to the checking station where Austin Hamer, game commission information agent, identified the stranger as a juvenile white-winged scoter, the first scoter ever to be recorded at the Summer Lake station.

Because of its rare occurrence at Summer Lake, the hunter donated the bird to Vernon Maw, Summer Lake waterfowl biologist, who will mount the bird and add it to the Summer Lake collection.

Before the day was through, two more of the scoters were checked through the station, with the hunters reporting having seen a flock of at least 15 of the large, blackish colored waterfowl.

Normally the scoters are a sea bird, spending most of their time along the coast and the coastal bays and inlets. Nesting, however, usually takes place inland on large bodies of water, with the greatest nesting taking place in northern Canada and Alaska. In the fall they migrate back to the coastal areas wintering from Alaska to California.

White-winged scoters have been recorded by hunters several times in the past at Klamath Lake. This is the first time they have been recorded during the hunting season as far inland as Summer Lake.
