Turncoats Plan Talks Against Russians

PORTLAND — Three former turncoat soldiers start out Friday on their ambitious plans for a series of anti-Communist speeches.

To accomplish the last, they will have to get the Army to change their discharges from dishonorable to honorable. Their attorney said he would try.

"When the Army learns the true story of what happened to these men, the complexion of the situation will change," attorney George T. Davis, San Francisco, said.

The three—Lewis W. Griggs, 23, Jacksonville, Texas; William A. Cowart, 22, Dalton, Ga., and Otho G. Bell, 24, Hillsboro, Miss.—are scheduled to make their first anti-Communist speech at the Wings of Healing Church in downtown Portland Friday night.

They flew to Portland Thursday for the church speeches. Davis said he was paying for the trip to Portland.

The three said they were coerced by the Reds into staying in China. Asked about their statements in China that they willingly accepted communism, Cowart said, "No-

body in Communist hands has a free choice about what he says." Bell, whose wife lives in Olympia, said the Reds told him they would have Communism in this country kill her unless he stayed in China.

They also told him he had been sentenced to death in this country, he said.

"This really hit me. I had a nervous breakdown. They put me in the psycho ward a couple of times. Then tension built up and I didn't know what to do.

"I figured I could find out for sure about that death sentence when I got to Pannunjon. Then they told me 'if you go over there (to the explanation tent) and find

out there really is a death sentence waiting for you, and if then you come back to us, then we'll give you a death sentence."

"Then they told me my wife already was on her way to China. So I stayed. It wasn't for seven months that I really found out they'd lied about all of it," Bell said.

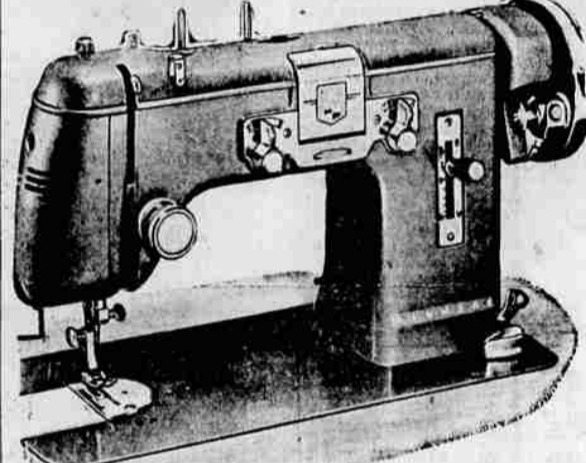
Griggs told of their plan to team in writing a book about their experiences. He also said he was thinking of becoming a church missionary.

Griggs said he was not surprised at the court verdict that freed them.

"This is a democracy, after all," he said.
