## Democracy Contest To Be Judged

The winner of the Voice of Democracy Contest will be picked Tuesday night following a broadcast from KPJI at 8:30 o'clock. Nine contestants representing the high schools of the county will compete.

The contest, sponsored locally by the Klamath County Junior Chamber of Commerce, is part of a nationwide script writing and voicing competition which gives high school students a chance to speak for democracy.

A tape recording of the county winner's speech will be sent to the state competition. The state winners will compete regionally and the final four national coequal winners will be picked by a panel of nationally-known citizens.

The four top winners will receive an expense-free trip to Washington, D.C., a \$500 college scholarship check and will meet the President and other top government officials.

Contest Chairman Jack Otterbein announced Saturday that Charles Patterson, Gilchrist High School junior; Jack Berry, Malin High senior; and John Vandenberg, Sacred Heart Academy senior will be among the nine county contestants. The other six contestants will be announced Monday.

The local speeches will be judged by Joseph Mercer of the Modoc Toastmasters Club, Mrs. Paul Landry and Mrs. Addie Mae Nixon, city librarian.

## Man's Body Discovered In Car Trunk

YAKIMA — An unidentified man's body, clad only in a pair of G.I. trousers, was found in the trunk of an abandoned California-licensed car here Saturday.

A small chest was the only apparent mark on the body. State Patrol and sheriff's officers reported. The body was doubled up in the trunk of the car which had been abandoned for two or three days near the fairgrounds at the edge of the city.

Officers said the 1952 car was registered to Hollis Boone of Shafter, Calif.

Dr. Ralph Shirey, Yakima County coroner, said after an autopsy death was caused by a stab wound which penetrated the heart and cut two ribs. A big knife was apparently used and the victim probably lived for half an hour, he added.

He estimated the man's age as 35 and said he had been dead about 72 hours when found. He was about 6 feet tall, weighed about 180 pounds and had brown hair.

As the investigation proceeded, officers said their belief was strengthened that the man was Boone.

The car was towed to a garage Friday night after a woman reported it had been standing near the fairgrounds for several days. The body was not discovered until Saturday morning. Officers became suspicious and opened the trunk after spotting blood stains near it.

Bloody underclothing, a brown plaid wool shirt and a pair of field boots were found in the front seat. Officers said there was no evidence of any struggle in the car.

An autopsy was scheduled by Dr. Ralph Shirey, Yakima County coroner.

## Lane Man Killed In Auto Crash

EUGENE — Frode Bruce, 56, Junction City, was killed Friday night in a head-on collision on Highway 99 about one mile south of Junction City.

State police said his car passed another vehicle, then smashed into an oncoming automobile.
