Distribution And Use Of Water In Klamath River Compact Terms Explained

The Oregon-California Klamath River Compact, which has been completed and agreed upon by the River Commission of the two states, is a historic step in the preservation of the water of the Klamath River for benefit of the Oregon Klamath River Commission. A digest of the compact has been prepared by Nelson Reed, chairman of the Oregon Klamath River Commission. This digest is being published by the Herald and News in a series of installments, of which this is the first.

Article I. Purpose.—A. To facilitate the orderly development, conservation and control of water for domestic, municipal and irrigation use.

To protect fish, wild life and recreation. To provide for the use of water for industrial and hydroelectric power development.

To provide for navigation and flood control. B. To provide for the equitable distribution and use of water among the two states and the Federal Government.

To provide for the preferential rights to the use of water for the anticipated ultimate requirements for domestic, municipal and irrigation purposes in the Upper Klamath River Basin in California and Oregon.

To provide the order of preference for rights to the beneficial use of water.

Definition of Terms.—A. "Klamath River Basin" shall mean the drainage area of the Klamath River and its tributaries within the states of California and Oregon and all closed basin included in the "Upper Klamath Basin" (example: Swan Lake, Butte Valley).

Article II. Distribution and Use of Water.—A. There are hereby recognized by both states vested rights to the use of waters originating within the Upper Klamath River Basin validly established and subsisting as of the effective date of this Compact under the laws of the state in which the use is made.

B. Subject to the rights recognized by subdivision A of this article, waters within the Upper Klamath River Basin shall be made available as reasonably required for domestic, municipal and irrigation uses, by direct diversion or by storage for later use, in the Klamath Project after the effective date of this Compact in accordance with the laws of the state where the use is to be made.

C. Such of the waters within the Upper Klamath River Basin as are not required to satisfy the rights and uses described in subdivisions A and B of this article shall be made available as reasonably required for any beneficial use, by direct diversion or by storage for later use, in the Klamath River Basin in either state after the effective date of this Compact in accordance with the laws of the state where the use is to be made, subject to the following provisions:

1. In granting permits to appropriate waters from available rights to the use of water for preference categories (a), (b), (c), (d), (e) or (f), as set forth in paragraph 2 of this subdivision C, upon a permit being granted and a right becoming vested and perfected by use, priority in right to the use of water shall be governed by priority in time within the entire Upper Klamath River Basin regardless of state boundaries.

The date of priority of any right to the use of water appropriated for the purpose above enumerated shall be the date of the filing of the application therefor, but such priority shall be dependent on: (1) commencement of construction within one year after the date of filing of the application; and (2) completion of the works within five years after the date, except that either or both of these periods may be extended by the appropriate official of the state of place of use if such official finds that there has been due diligence in the starting or prosecution of the work, as the case may be. Each state shall promptly provide the Commission and the appropriate official of the other state with complete information as to such applications and as to all actions taken thereon.

2. All rights to use waters made available under this subdivision C for categories (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), or (f), as set forth in paragraph 1 of this subdivision C, in either state shall be subject to and inferior to any rights to use such waters for preference categories (a) and (b), as set forth in paragraph 1 of this subdivision C, in either state regardless of the time when such rights may have been initiated or become vested and perfected, and without the payment of any compensation therefor. But such superior rights to use water for preference category (b) in California shall be limited to the quantity of water necessary to irrigate 100,000 acres of land and in Oregon shall be limited to the quantity of water necessary to irrigate 200,000 acres of land. Annual diversions for the irrigation of such lands, measured at points fixed by the Commission, shall not exceed three acre-feet per acre as an average for the land actually irrigated.

Irrigable lands not now irrigated comprising 100,000 acres in California and 200,000 acres in Oregon in the Upper Klamath River Basin could be brought into production by irrigation with waters of the Upper Klamath River Basin, and it is contemplated that such irrigation will be accomplished as and when determined to be feasible.

ity of the United States in connection with any water use or control development, located anywhere in the Klamath River Basin, constructed by or under the authority of the United States for the production of power or for flood control navigation or other uses that are nonconsumptive in character.

E. Future rights to store the waters of the Klamath River for later use for categories (c), (d), (e), and (f), as set forth in paragraph 1 of subdivision C hereof, may be granted after the date of this Compact with appropriate priorities under applicable law, but such storage rights shall not interfere (a) with the storage of water in Upper Klamath Lake for domestic, municipal and irrigation use, or (b) with any other storage for domestic, municipal and irrigation use of the waters of the Klamath River in the Upper Klamath River Basin.

F. A surveyors description of the "Upper Klamath Basin" and a proper map is furnished to state and federal agencies as required. (To Be Continued)
