Salable arrivals totaled 32,000 head, around double what they have been running on Mondays. Most 200 to 220 pound butchers brought \$12.00 to \$12.50 with 220 to 250 pounders at \$11.25 to \$12.00. About 250 head of 190 to 220 pounders brought \$12.00, the top. This was the lowest top since Feb. 19, 1942, when \$12.80 was the peak. Sows sold from \$10.00 to \$11.00. Steers and heifers sold steady to 50 cents higher. Top on prime steers was \$24.25 with most choice and prime kinds going at \$19.50 to \$23.50. Prime heifers topped at \$21.75. Buyers paid \$17.00 to \$18.75 for good to prime, mostly good to choice, woolled lambs.

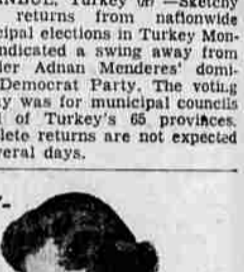
SWING
