

Heart Disease Takes Tobin

INDIANAPOLIS (AP)—Daniel J. Tobin, Irish immigrant boy who became head of the biggest American labor union, died last night of high blood pressure and heart disease.

The president of the AFL Teamsters Union from 1907 until 1952 was 83 but didn't know the exact date of his birth in County Clare, Ireland.

Tobin was a confidant of President Franklin D. Roosevelt and headed the labor division of the Democratic National Committee in each of FDR's election campaigns.

He fought communism, urged his followers to consider the strike only as a weapon of last resort, and advocated merger of the AFL and CIO.

He was a man of strong opinions in his 45 years as head of the teamsters, but his conception of craft unionism finally was swallowed up by the unlimited jurisdiction policy of Dave Beck of Seattle, who succeeded him.

Tobin came to the United States in 1860 and made \$11 a week on one of his first jobs. The Teamsters Union paid him \$30,000 a year and traveling expenses, and provided a winter home for him in Miami Beach.

When he became president emeritus, he and Beck each were given salaries of \$50,000 a year.

Tobin was credited with persuading two rival teamsters' unions to merge in 1903 into the international brotherhood. He became its first general president in 1907. He was treasurer of the AFL from 1917 to 1928 and became vice president in 1933.

Tobin represented the United States in several international labor conferences.

He was often at odds with other union leaders in World War II, telling teamsters to ignore other unions' picket lines.

He is survived by his second wife Irene; a daughter, Miss Katherine Tobin, and five sons, Frank L. Frederick A., Joseph V., John M. and Edmund P. Tobin. His first wife Annie died, leaving the five sons.

Funeral services will be held here Thursday, with burial in Cambridge, Mass.

Luz Resigns From Chamber

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina (AP)—Ousted President Carlos Luz resigned as president of the Chamber of Deputies Monday, removing the last constitutional obstacle to the new government of acting president Nereu Ramos.

Luz reviewed his short-lived administration in a speech to the chamber which lasted an hour and a half. He prefaced it by saying he had presented a letter to Chamber President Flores Dacunha formally resigning the presidency.

But Luz said he was not resigning his seat as a deputy. Members of the Labor and Social Democratic parties walked out of the chamber when he began speaking and returned when he had nearly finished.

Luz could have caused a constitutional scrap for the administration of Acting President Nereu Ramos if he had not chosen to step down as president of the chamber.

Luz became acting president as next in line of succession when Joao Cafe Jr., took a leave of absence to recover from a heart attack. But Congress declared him unfit to serve after the military coup last week and named Ramos, President of the Senate, to replace him.

Free pheasant will also be served. The "Come As You Are" dinner is being given to bolster the guild's treasury.

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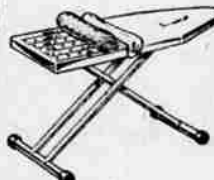
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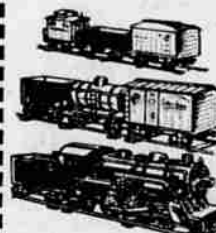
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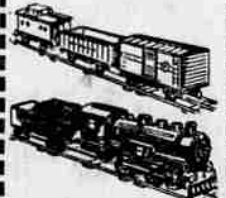
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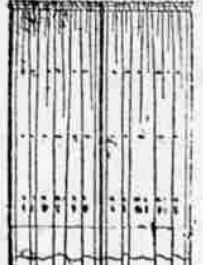
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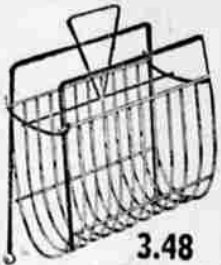
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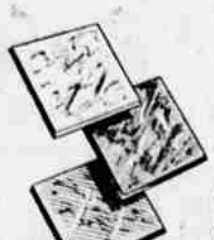
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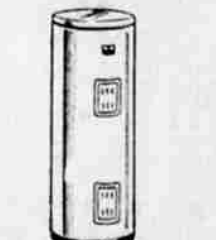
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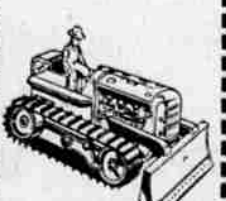
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
