New Popularity For Solitaire

At first, writers on cards and retailers were inclined to relate the Solitaire vogue to the increase in the American life-span. They point to the population experts' prediction that by 1960 there will be 16 million people in the United States over 65 years of age—a million more than the total population of Canada. But then it was discovered that an increasing number of younger people, under the day-by-day tension of modern living, were finding a few minutes of relief each day in a hand or two of Canfield or Patience or another of the Solitaire variations. And at the same time the popularity of Solitaire with children doesn't seem to have abated.

Probably the most widely publicized instance of this child-and-adult interest in the game was the 1955 birthday gift to President Eisenhower from his granddaughter—a book called "150 Ways to Play Solitaire."

And just a few days ago the reporters found world's heavy-weight champion Rocky Marciano relaxing with a game of Solitaire before being the guest of honor at an elaborate luncheon in New York City.
