LAS VEGAS, Nev. (AP) — Clouds shrouding a snowy mountain peak hampered air and ground parties struggling Friday to reach an Air Force transport plane which crashed with 14 persons aboard while enroute to the Nevada atomic bombing range Thursday.

Bad Storms In Nation Diminishing

Snow and rain fell in Western States Friday but violent storms which lashed broad areas of the nation this week appeared diminishing.

The windy, snowy, cold weather was blamed for at least 13 deaths. Nine persons were missing and presumed dead. Four other persons were reported snowbound in the mountains over Boulder, Colo., which was hit by an 18-inch snowfall Monday.

The Arctic air which gripped the Northern Rockies and Northern Plains for several days appeared nearly broken Friday morning.
