

### Abbott Case Sees 16th Witness Up

OAKLAND, Calif. (UP) — The prosecution prepared today to call a woman as the 16th witness in the trial of a tubercular accounting student accused of murdering a teen-age schoolgirl.

Dist. Atty. J. Frank Coakley declined yesterday to name the woman who he hoped would be another link in the chain of evidence against the slender defendant, Burto W. Abbott.

Abbott, 17, is accused of luring 14-year-old Stephanie Bryan to her death last April 28. Abbott claims he was driving to his mountain cabin in far Northern California at the time Stephanie disappeared.

Stephanie's body was found near the cabin July 20.

But several prosecution witnesses testified last week they saw Abbott in Berkeley from an hour to a half-hour before Stephanie's disappearance. Other witnesses testified they saw a girl who looked like Stephanie struggling with a man driving a car similar to Abbott's on a nearby highway.

Meanwhile, there were indications that the prosecution case was approaching one of its most dramatic peaks, the moment when the parents of the slain girl face the man accused of killing her.

Coakley was expected to call Dr. and Mrs. Charles S. Bryan to testify in the near future, possibly within the next few days.

It would be the first meeting between the Bryans and Abbott.

Part of Coakley's courtroom strategy which became apparent as the trial proceeded, was to keep the identity of his witnesses a secret until the moment they were called in court. He has left no doubt that the most sensational testimony is yet to come.

The trial will be in session only three days this week. Superior Judge Charles Wade Snook has declared Thursday and Friday court holidays because of Thanksgiving Day.

NEW DELHI, India (AP) — Nikita Khrushchev, Russian Communist Party boss, may doubt the efficacy of an Indian good luck sign, a pretty Indian girl dabbed on his forehead Monday.

Half an hour later, in a Boy Scout camp, Prime Minister Nehru stretched out on a string campbed and then asked Khrushchev to try it as well. The bulky Russian, who appears to outweigh 100-pound Nehru by at least 40 pounds, did so—and it collapsed under him.

### Army, Air Force Feuding Over Merits Of Missiles

WASHINGTON (UP) — The Army and Air Force are feuding over the results of secret guided missile tests in which the Army's Nike duelled the Air Force's Matador.

The tests were held to determine the effectiveness of the 1,600 mile-an-hour Nike against modern jet bombers. That much-publicized missile was pitted against an Air Force Matador jet bomber missile with a speed of 600 miles an hour.

The Nike knocked down at least one Matador — two by Army claims — but missed on several

The Matador was chosen as the target because it is, in effect, a pilotless fighter-bomber with the speed but not the size of present jet bombers.

But the inconclusiveness of the tests only added new fire to a long-standing controversy between the two services.

The Air Force account of the test is that the Nike scored one kill and missed on several other shots. The Army said it missed on four test firings held last month but scored kills on both of two shots fired early this month.

The stage for the long-heralded duel was set nearly three years ago when the Army unveiled the Nike with claims it was so good "it is almost impossible for them to miss a target." The unveiling was accompanied by pictures showing the Nike knocking a World War II B17 bomber out of the sky.

Since then, the Army has installed Nike battalions around most of the nation's major cities and industrial centers.

**Ten Die When Train Jumps Track**

MILTON, England (AP) — A least 10 persons were dead Monday and more than 100 injured following a derailment which turned three coaches of a Wales-to-London express train into a death trap.

A search crew of more than 500 pulled the wreckage apart throughout the night, finding the bodies of nine women and one man. At least 30 of the injured remained in critical condition.

The train was carrying 290 excursionists from cities in South Wales, bound for an outing in the British capital. The engine and three coaches left the rails and toppled down a 20-foot embankment after passing a switch.
