

Icy Roads Cause Wreck

Icy road conditions were blamed Sunday for an accident which sent three persons to the hospital about 3 p.m.

Mr. and Mrs. Keith Turner and his mother, who live between Bonanza and Dairy, had driven to the Clay Walker place in Layzell Valley to buy turkeys. When their car stalled, Mrs. Walker offered to drive them home. On Highway 69, near the Frank Totell place, the car hit an icy spot and went out of control, striking a power pole and knocking down about 100 feet of fence. The car was practically demolished.

Dick Peppie of Klamath Falls came along and took the Turners to Klamath Valley Hospital where they were treated for cuts received when the windshield shattered and for bruises. They were released from the hospital. Mrs. Walker is to have X-rays today.

Gilchrist Death Learned

Mrs. Frank Rust Gilchrist, mother of Frank W. Gilchrist of the Klamath lumber operation in Northern Klamath County, died November 17 in a hospital in Mississippi. She had been in ill health for several months. Word of her death reached local friends November 15.

Mrs. Gilchrist had visited on many occasions with relatives in the Oregon town that bears the family name. Her last visit was last Christmas.

In addition to her son who was with her in Laurel at the time of her death, she is survived by two daughters, Mrs. P. K. Fletcher, Alpen, Michigan and Mrs. John K. Howell, of Grants Mills, Ohio. Frank R. Gilchrist of Gilchrist is a grandson.

Arthur Erickson Death Learned

Funeral services will be held Tuesday, November 22, at 2 p.m. in the Methodist Church at Fort Jones for Arthur Erickson, lifelong resident of Siskiyou County who died November 20 at Hillsdale Hospital. He was 68 years old.

Death followed a coronary thrombosis suffered on Saturday, November 19. He had suffered from a heart condition for several years.

Mr. Erickson had been a resident of Tennant, California and an employee of the logging division of the Long Bell Lumber Company near Tennant for 30 years.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Eva Erickson and one son, George Erickson, both of Tennant. A brother Charles Erickson, Etna, California, also survives.

The body was taken to O'Hair's Memorial Chapel and later to Fort Jones.

Nebraska Highway Crash Claims Lives Of Ten As Cars Collide Headon

Death struck in wholesale lots, killing 21 persons in three highway accidents Sunday.

One of the smashups killed 10 persons, and the others six and five. Most of the victims were on Sunday outings.

The worst highway massacre was near Dixon, Neb., where a tire blew on a car carrying six teenagers from a church party Sunday night. Their auto careened headon into a car carrying four musicians to a dance date.

All 10 persons were killed. One of the boys was thrown upon the highway, while the bodies of the other five were found in the shattered car. The musicians' car burst into flames and it was hours before their charred bodies could be identified.

Sheriff Sam Curry identified the crowd boys as Ronald Nobbe, Terry Book, Gary Stark, Robert Rakow, Rodney Hanks, and Richard Rahn, all of Marienburg, Neb. Nobbe was identified as the driver, but the boys' ages were not immediately known.

The musicians were James E. Martelle, 30, Turle Creek, Pa.; Jack Rem, Pittsburgh, Pa.; Lou Case, Rock Island, Ill.; and Don Sheffield, 26, St. Johnsbury, Vt. They were members of the 12-piece Jimmy Palmers dance band and

were en route to play at a Norfolk, Neb., dance.

Near Forreton, Ill., meanwhile, six persons were killed in a car-train crash, and five died in a headon smashup near Princeton, Mo.

The Illinois crash wiped out two families, including two children. Their bodies, and the wreckage of their car were scattered for three quarters of a mile after the speeding Union Pacific Challenger plowed into their car at a grade crossing.

The dead were Alvin Wagner, 29, his wife, Joan, 30; Wayne Zettle, 31; his wife, Jo Ann, 34; and their children, Marilyn, 7, and Becky, 4. The Orangeville, Ill., farm families were on an outing to Dixon, Ill., when they died.

Near Princeton, a mother, her son, and a friend were returning from a dance when their car crashed nearly headon with another auto at a curve.

Killed in one car were Vernon Harold Musgrave, 28, Kansas City, Mo.; his mother, Mrs. Johnny Musgrave, Princeton; and a friend, William McKay, 22, Kansas City. Arven L. Smothers, 23, Davis City, Iowa, and Gary Lane, 17, Blythe-gale, Mo., died in the other auto.

Peppermint Meet Slated

TULELAKE — A meeting for persons interested in the production of peppermint in the Tulelake area will be held at 7:30 o'clock tonight in the new office building of the Tulelake field station.

Subjects for discussion will be cultural methods and marketing. Two plots grown this year at the University of California field station, Tulelake and on the Stan Buckingham ranch indicated that the crop can be grown here profitably with further study of reducing production costs.

Samples of the mint were sent to Dan Fry and his son, Dan Fry Jr. for oil analysis. The Fry's, who operate a peppermint farm near Portland had planned to be at the meeting tonight but have been detained because of illness.

The results of the tests will be announced at a later meeting for prospective growers.

Wild Gun Battle In Tavern Ends With One Man Killed

RICKREALL, Ore. (AP)—A service station operator, deputized moments before by a state policeman, shot and killed a holdup man in a gun battle at a tavern here Sunday evening.

The police officer, John Mekker, suffered non-critical wounds in the shoulder and arm in the shooting affray.

Police said that Herschel Greenwade, 24, fatally wounded Wallace Cunningham, 35, of Portland, in the chest after Cunningham had shot Mekker.

Robert Scott Kenyon, 31, of Salem, who police said had aided Cunningham in the \$100 holdup, surrendered and was held at the Polk County jail.

Mrs. Charlene James, the barmaid, said that the two men had entered the tavern at about 5:30 p.m., and ordered beer. Suddenly they produced revolvers and herded all the customers into a restroom at the rear of the tavern after forcing Mrs. James to turn over the money.

The eight customers who had been locked into the restroom boosted H. G. Cope of Salem over

a partition. He went to the adjoining apartment of the tavern owner, Ellsworth Wilson, and Mrs. Wilson called the state police at Salem.

Mekker's patrol car was parked in Greenwade's service station across from the tavern as the report of the holdup was broadcast.

He gave Greenwade a rifle, deputized him and the two of them entered the tavern.

Cunningham, refusing to surrender, shot twice at Mekker. Greenwade fired once at Cunningham, but missed. He ran outside and fired again through the tavern's front window. The bullet entered

Cunningham's chest, killing him almost instantly.

Mekker was taken to a Salem hospital where his condition was reported as not critical.
