

Adopted Russian Children Make Progress In Tulelake

Two young girls who have known the terror of fleeing from communism, who have lived in refugee camps and who finally found sanctuary in the Western hemisphere, are learning to read and write and speak the language of their adopted country in the Newell Elementary School, south of Tulelake.

Frieda, 18, and her 13-year-old sister Tina, born in Sgradovka, Ukraine, are now the adopted daughters of Mr. and Mrs. Cornelius N. Neufeld, Tulelake ranchers of Copcock Bay in Modoc County.

With their mother, grandmother, aunts and many friends, the girls fled Russia with the retreating German army at the close of World War II. In Germany they lived meagerly in a refugee camp until 1947. Their father was presumed killed during service with the Russian army.

The primitive life proved too strenuous for many of them. In 1951 Frieda's and Tina's mother died and word of her death was sent to Mr. and Mrs. Neufeld who immediately began negotiations to bring the two girls to the United States.

It took a special act of Congress, following an appeal to Congressman Clair Engle, (D) of California to make it possible for the girls to come to this country. They arrived by Braniff Air Lines at Dallas, Texas, on September 8 of this year where Mr. and Mrs. Neufeld and their other three adopted children met them.

Minister Saves 400 Own Children

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) — An alert Assembly of God minister and his brother were credited today with saving the lives of their 400 children when a fire of undetermined origin destroyed their church and home in the northwest suburb of the city.

The Rev. T. C. Hurley said he was awakened before midnight and discovered the living quarters, located above the church, in flames.

"I jumped out the window and shouted for my brother to throw my wife and children out," the minister said. He sprained his hip in the fall.

W. A. Hurley stabbed his own

son Clyde, 6, and the minister's daughter Sue and tossed them out the window to the minister. He next gathered the other children, ranging in age from 2 to 10, and threw them to the minister just before flames swept through the second floor of the building.

The church, known as the Oneness Church of Jesus Christ, was destroyed. There was no immediate estimate of damage.
