

Slavs Say Tito, Dulles Rumor False

WASHINGTON (UP)—Yugoslavia has branded as "false" and "distorted" reports that Marshal Tito agreed with Secretary of State John Foster Dulles that Soviet satellites should be freed.

The nation's state-controlled radio charged that Western newspapers deliberately tried to "persuade the public that Yugoslavia had agreed to the problematic conception of changing the status of the East European countries by force."

Yugoslavia's objections grew out of interpretations placed on a statement made by Dulles at the conclusion of his recent talks with Tito. While Tito nodded agreement Dulles said: "We arrived at the joint accord that it is necessary to recognize the importance of the independence of those Eastern European countries, non-interference from abroad in their internal problems, and the right for them to choose according to their free will their economic and social order."

Some American newspapers interpreted this as a pledge by Tito to help in the U.S. campaign to free the satellites from Russia's grip.

American officials said these interpretations embarrassed Yugoslavia in her improved relations with Russia.

The Yugoslav radio flatly denied that Tito "accepted the American thesis on the attitude toward the Eastern European countries."

Other Women Trouble Leads To Killing Of Former Marine

LOS ANGELES (AP)—A housewife knelt praying for an hour beside her sleeping husband's bed Thursday then killed him with a bullet through the temple, police reported.

"All during our married life, for more than seven years, it has been one girl after another," Mrs. Nina Sorensen, 39, sobbed to officers.

They quoted her as saying: She and her husband, William, 39, aircraft worker and Marine Corps veteran, had been "having trouble for six or seven months because of another woman." They argued, then her husband went to bed.

"Today is Thanksgiving. Everything is a big mess now. I don't know how I could have done it. We were supposed to go to dinner together later today."

"I should have got rid of that gun long ago."

"Last night I was bothered with a migraine headache. I've been having them for months and can't stand them. It came on after my husband and I argued over that other woman. The last one . . . for the past year, and she's married and has children."

"After my husband went to bed I sat and watched television and prayed. I kept thinking of our troubles. I went into the bedroom."

"I knelt down beside him and prayed for about an hour. I went to my dresser and took out my gun (a .25 caliber pistol)."

"I went back to his side. I knelt

down again. I prayed again—and then I shot him."

She called police herself, and told officers the argument started after Sorensen called her from the home of the other woman, then came home to "decide what to do about this situation."

The couple had no children. Mrs. Sorensen, who declined to identify the other woman, was booked on suspicion of murder.
