Horticultural Meeting Set

Oregon fruit and vegetable growers can "pick and choose" from more than 50 special sessions on latest research findings and farmer-experiences at the 70th annual meeting of the Oregon State Horticultural Society, Thursday and Friday, at Oregon State College.

Special observance of the "Three Score and Ten" gathering of Oregon's oldest farm commodity group has filled the program with "top men in all fields of horticulture," reports secretary C. O. Rawlings, OSC extension horticulturist.

Key speakers for morning general assemblies are Dr. Irving Krick, nationally-known meteorologist, who will review the new frontier of "weather control," and Dr. Edward Vaughan, OSC botanist, who will give an illustrated report of agriculture in six European countries.

Dr. Krick was weather consultant to the U.S. armed forces during World War II and in recent years has gained prominence in attempting to modify the weather and in making long-range weather forecasts.

Dr. Vaughan returned recently from a year in Europe on a Guggenheim fellowship where he studied virus diseases of horticultural crops. His talk will include colored slides from Spain, Switzerland, Austria, Germany, Denmark and Holland.

Following the general assembly each morning, the meeting will divide into group sessions for research and industry reports on small fruit, stone fruit, apples and pears, and vegetables.

Scheduled topics to strengthen the multi-million dollar fruit and vegetable industry include new trends in packaging, marketing, and sales promotion; use of growth-regulating chemicals to increase fruit size; wood wastes to heat orchards; new varieties; and latest research in control of insects, plant diseases, and weeds.

Panel discussions, presentation of awards, special exhibits, and the annual banquet are other program highlights. Attendance is not limited to Horticultural Society members. Rawlings stated in urging all growers to attend. Registration starts each day at 8:30 a.m.
