# Fears Voiced By Canadians Over Gigantic Yukon Plan

VICTORIA, B.C. (AP) — Fear that the United States may wreck Canada's ambition to harness the fast-flowing Yukon River as part of a huge Northwestern power project was voiced Monday before the Gordon Economic Commission.

Northwest Power Industries Ltd., the Ventures-Profisher company working on Yukon-Nass River power plants, said it is proposing the Nass River as the first-stage development because it sees as yet no clear road in getting the Yukon project actually started.

The Yukon cuts through the international border between the Yukon and Alaska and flows to the Bering Sea. The Nass, located in Upper British Columbia, flows south within British Columbia boundaries. No international problems are involved, the company said.

Together, the two projects, the Nass and the Yukon, could produce a total of some 6,333,000 horsepower, providing low-cost energy which could pave the way for an industrial boom in Northern B.C.

But the Yukon would be by far the biggest project, ultimately producing some 4,900,000 horsepower against 455,000 for the Nass. Northwest Power has been working on the Yukon project for the last three years. It expects to complete its engineering and survey studies in 1956 and begin designing a possible power plant. Studies on the Nass have started only this year. Field surveys may start in 1956.

"The economy feasibility of the Yukon River project is becoming established and investigations made to date of the Nass River area show most promising possibilities," the company said.

But it continued: "The Yukon River power plan,

known as the Yukon-Atlin-Taku Power Project, involves the diversion of Upper Yukon waters southward into British Columbia. As these waters naturally flow through Alaska to the Bering Sea, there is a potentially serious international factor involved.

"With these international complications affecting development of the Yukon River plan, the company has proposed that the Nass River project be a first-stage development of the over-all Northwest power project.

A wholly provincial stream, comes within 25 miles of the proposed power project. It also has the benefit of later exchange and integration of power output with that of the Yukon project."

## County Groups Plan Election

Directors and the new officers take office January 1. The new board of directors will select the secretary, a post held for the last several years by T. L. Stanley, Redding; and the president elect will name the committees for the coming year.

The nominating committee reported to the Board of Directors November 12 at the group's last meeting of this current year, held in Redding.

In October, Jackson, Siskiyou County supervisor of the third district, was appointed to two state positions, chairman of the health and hospital committee of the County Supervisors Association; and as a member of the board of directors of the County Supervisors Association of California to which he was elected at the annual supervisors' convention held in Monterey.
