

### Senate Probes Army Plan For Security Safeguards

WASHINGTON (AP)—Senate investigators sought today a precise explanation of how the Army will handle security risk cases under the terms of a new directive.

In general the directive instructs that an effort be made to spot potential security risks before they are drafted for Army service. If found, they are exempted from induction—and thus spared the stigma of a less than honorable discharge for preserve conduct.

Chairman Philip Young of the Civil Service Commission testified yesterday that three of every four cases involving "serious questions of security" never are told they are suspected risks.

They embrace a group, he said, who are fired for cause—in some cases for drunkenness—and against whom security risk accusations also have been made.

Young, who keeps the administration's official box score of security risk firings and resignations, said he combines into a single total the number ousted as downright security risks and those fired for nonrisk reasons but against whom there also is a backlog of other derogatory information.

Hennings has denounced the practice as a misleading "numbers game."

Young's newest box score listed firings of 3,683 persons between May 28, 1953, (when the program began) and last Sept. 30. This was 60 more than were listed in the period through June 30.

He said 704 persons were "terminated because of security questions within the purview" of President Eisenhower's directive, in the 12 months ended Sept. 30.

Of them, he said, 531 were never charged formally with being security risks or notified they were suspected, while being dropped on other grounds. He said about the same percentage could be applied fairly to the entire 3,683 cases.

He said he doesn't claim that all were security risks, and that about the only time he uses that term is by inadvertence, as he did repeatedly at the hearing.

"Frankly," Young said, "I don't know the definition of a security risk."

### Nationalist China Expected To Veto Mongolia For UN

WASHINGTON (AP)—Nationalist China has indicated privately it will veto the admission of Outer Mongolia to the United Nations, a high American official told the United Press.

Such a veto presumably would wreck an East-West agreement painstakingly worked out after years of deadlock for the admission of 17 other countries to the world organization.

The official, who wished to remain anonymous, said the Nationalists were prepared to risk the wrath of the great majority of U.N. members who favor the admission agreement.

Chinese Nationalist officials have frequently emphasized their opposition to the package admission deal but have never said publicly that the veto would be used to stop it.

The package calls for the United States to withhold its opposition to U.N. membership for five Communist dominated countries—Albania, Bulgaria, Hungary, Rumania and Outer Mongolia.

Russia, in turn, would not oppose 13 other nations the United States would like to see in the United Nations. These are Austria, Cambodia, Ceylon, Finland, Ireland, Italy, Japan, Jordan, Laos,

Libya, Nepal, Portugal and Spain. The "package deal" had appeared assured when this country reluctantly made clear it would not vote against Outer Mongolia. It was assumed the United States could bring enough pressure to get the Nationalists to abstain on the vote.

Albert's parents had already begun looking for him. When they could not find him, they notified police that evening.

Fourteen policemen, aided by a dozen volunteers, searched the sloughs near the Wylie home yesterday for the child. Last night they questioned every adult and child in the region.

An all points bulletin broadcast yesterday described Albert as wearing blue jeans, a red plaid shirt and black cowboy boots. He is a Negro.
