

### Lake Begins Reseeding

LAKEVIEW — Grass reseeding by airplane of 5,150 acres of Fremont National Forest land began Monday morning, according to Clifton Windle, in charge of range management on the Fremont National Forest. Areas to be reseeded are in sections burned by last summer and fall forest fires.

Included in the project will be reseeding of 2,380 acres on Weyerhaeuser Timber Company land with the cost of seed and broadcasting to be paid by Weyerhaeuser.

Twenty-three tons of seed will be used for the national forest and the Weyerhaeuser reseeding, said Windle. The estimated cost of broadcasting on the government land will be approximately 60 cents per acre and the seed to be used will be a mixture of orchard grass and timothy.

Forest service pilot Ed Scholz, who is stationed at Cave Junction, is piloting the forest service plane and is assisted by a hopper tender. The plane carries a 1,000 pound load of seed which is broadcast within 300 feet of the tree tops, and distributed at 4 pounds per acre. During the operation, which must be done on a calm day, the plane flies 90 miles an hour and can reseed 15 acres a minute, Windle stated.

Areas to be reseeded are 1,005 acres on the Summer Lake burn in the Paisley district; 1,250 acres of the Round Butte burn in Bly district; 720 acres in the Dry Prairie burn in Bly district; 720 acres in the Dry Prairie burn in Bly district; 1,980 acres in Deming Creek burn in Bly district and 215 acres in Yocum burn in Drews Valley.

Windle stated that in December 1951 successful reseeding by helicopter was done on the Camp Creek, Willow Creek and Dog Lake burns. A rainy spring that year made favorable growing conditions for the grass seed, which helps hold the soil in place until new seedlings come up.

### Safe Driving Director Calls For Better Showing In 1955

PORTLAND—With a tabulation of traffic fatalities on the 10 days preceding and following December 1, E. C. Sammons, Oregon state director for Safe-Driving Day, has notified all County S-D Day directors of the record Oregon should try to improve in the 1955 Safe-Driving Day, December 1.

Sammons pointed out that there were 34 traffic fatalities between November 22 and December 12 inclusive in 1954 and the success of S-D Day this year in Oregon will depend largely on the extent to which this record can be improved.

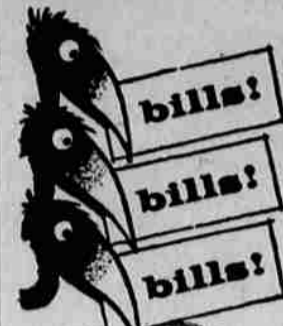
The fatalities by days include only those persons who died between November 22 and December 12, as a direct result of a motor vehicle traffic accident during that period.

On December 1, 1954, there were two traffic fatalities in Oregon, and Director Sammons is asking all communities to use every educational facility in urging the public to drive and walk that day so that there will be no fatalities. Safe-Driving Day in 1954 fell on December 15 and Oregon went through that day without any fatality reported during the 24-hour period, which enabled it to match the "no-fatality" record of December 15 the previous year.

The 1954 Safe-Driving Day also saw the total number of accidents in Oregon reduced about 40 per cent. An effort will be made to improve that record this year.

Nationally, there were 81 traffic fatalities on Thursday, December 2, 1954, the December 2 total being used because it fell on Thursday, the comparable date in 1954, with Thursday, December 1: S-D Day this year.

The President's committee has provided a formula to all State Accident Record Bureaus for reporting the fatalities resulting from traffic accidents on S-D Day and

### Ike Appeals To China Leader

TAIPEI, Formosa (AP)—Two appeals by President Eisenhower to President Chiang Kai-shek have apparently failed to change Nationalist China's determination to veto Outer Mongolia's admission to the United Nations if a veto is necessary.
