Shell Blast Hurts Woman

CORVALLIS — A woman was accidentally shot late Sunday night while trying to keep her home from burning to the ground. Mrs. Phillip Sauer, 52, underwent surgery in a hospital here Monday. She was wounded in the left ankle when a bullet exploded. Doctors believed a metal shell casing lodged in the ankle. Mrs. Sauer, her husband and their three children were next door at a neighbor's watching television when the fire started from undetermined origin. They ran to the house at Greenberry, 10 miles south of here, and fought the blaze but there was no water supply and they were unable to control it. She was wounded while she and others were inside removing clothing and other belongings. The house was destroyed. Loss was not immediately estimated.

Nutritionist Slated Here

The Oregon Dairy Council's nutritionist, Edith Herron, will be in Klamath Falls Tuesday through Thursday of this week to confer with county health, education and extension leaders. The Oregon Dairy Council carries on a statewide program of nutrition education and dairy products promotion. It is sponsored and financed by Oregon dairy producers and distributors. The Oregon Dairy Council, which moved a few months ago to new quarters in the New Fliedner building, Portland, is affiliated with the National Dairy Council and is one of 75 such units in the nation. While working in Klamath County, Miss Herron will call on Dr. S. M. Kerron, and staff at the Klamath County Health Department; Hope Holbrook and Mary McConnell at the county agent's office; Mrs. Eric Majors, executive secretary of the Klamath County Tuberculosis and Health Association; Carol B. Howe, county school superintendent; Mrs. Isabelle Brixner, Klamath County elementary supervisor; A. L. Gralapp, city school superintendent; J. V. LaClair, director of instructional materials for Klamath Falls city schools and others. Miss Herron will also meet with teachers in the city schools.

Two Fugitives Picked Up

GILROY, Calif. — Two fugitives from the Washington State Penitentiary at Walla Walla, were identified in the Gilroy jail Sunday after giving assumed names when they were arrested Friday hiding in the Gilroy Motor Co. shop. They are John Russell, 25, of Yakima, Wash., and Edward L. Burkholder, 23, of Springfield, Ore. They were arrested when Patrolman Joe Biafore investigated on seeing that some metal siding of the shop facing an alley had been pulled loose. Biafore recognized a nearby car with Oregon license plates, OR263 as "hot." One of the pair had the keys to it. In the car were a .43 automatic, two shotguns, a high powered rifle and a .22 rifle. Biafore said the men admitted burglarizing a Eureka, Calif., gun shop after the Dec. 1 escape and slugging and robbing a gasoline station attendant of \$60 at Fortuna, Calif. The automobile had been stolen in Washington and the plates switched.

George Fischer To Take Over Job On Plumas Unit

TULELAKE — George A. Fischer, ranger of the Doublehead District of the Modoc National Forest with headquarters at Tulelake is being transferred in a staff promotion to supervise the grazing, wildlife, recreation and land use activities of the Plumas National Forest with headquarters at Quincy, California. The announcement was made by William A. Peterson, Plumas National Forest supervisor. Fischer, for the past 15 years, ranger on the Doublehead, began his forest service career on the Plumas in 1931 after receiving his degree in range management from Washington State College. He came from the Lassen Forest to the Modoc in 1938 and for the following two years worked on a land use study of that forest. Before his assignment to the Doublehead he had served also on the Whitman, the Stanislaus and the Los Padres forests and with the forest and range experiment station, Berkeley. During his time here the district has twice been enlarged to include Medicine Lake and the headquarters buildings have been built. The transfer will become effective January 15. Fischer's replacement Elmo Brough, is being promoted from the Surprise Valley District at Cedarville. The Fischer family has been active in community and fraternal affairs during their residence in Tulelake. Fischer is a member of the Rotary Club, is a past president of the Tulelake Fire Department, currently secretary of the Tulelake Sportsmen's Club, he is a member of the Carby Cross Lodge, AP & AM, past patron of the Tulelake OES and member of the Hillah Temple Shrine, the Klamath Falls Scottish Rites Masons and the Klamath Falls Elks Lodge. Mrs. Fischer has taught in the Tulelake High School for several years, is a past president of the Tulelake elementary and high school PTAs, past matron of Zulema Temple, Daughters of the Nile, is a member of the Rainbow advisory board Tulelake for 10 years and of the Klamath Falls Chapter AAUW. Helene and George Jr., daughter and son, now students at Stanford University are also active in school and fraternal organizations.

Picket Line Violence Told

SEATTLE (AP) — An auxiliary deputy sheriff was injured and two men were arrested Sunday in a brief flareup of picket line violence in the United Air Lines flight engineers' strike. Melvin C. Cottle, 32, an auxiliary deputy serving as a guard for United, swore to a complaint charging third degree assault against George Laube, 32, a flight engineer, and Edward Daniels, 48, a longshoreman. Cottle said he was pulled from his car and struck on the head by five men outside the gates of Seattle's maintenance hangar at Seattle-Tacoma International Airport. The picket line disturbance followed the arrival Saturday night of 40 maritime union members in support of striking AFL Flight Engineers' Assn. After the disturbance, the airline obtained a temporary restraining order limiting pickets to two each at each of the six entrances to the UAL building. Flight engineers complied with the order and maritime men removed picket signs but remained nearby as "spectators."

Alert Policemen Quench Fire

A Klamath Falls police patrol used hand fire extinguishers to put out a fire in the seat of a pickup truck early Sunday morning. The fire was noticed by the patrolling officers, who pulled the smoldering seat out of the truck and sprayed with an extinguisher in their car. The truck was owned by Steve Washburn, 2154 Eberlein. Cause of the fire is unknown, but the officers said it might have been due to a dropped cigarette. The incident occurred at 4:15 a.m.
