Reds Return To India

RANGOON, Burma (AP)—Communist party boss Nikita S. Khrushchev and Soviet Premier Nikolai Bulganin headed back to India today on their South Asian tour. During their seven-day visit in Burma, the Russian leaders used every opportunity to lambaste the West. Bulganin and Burmese Premier U Nu signed a joint demand for turning Formosa over to Red China and for a ban on nuclear weapons. The views expressed were the same both countries have been plugging for some time. Settling Indochina's political future in accordance with last year's Geneva conference ending the Indochina War. The armistice terms call for elections next July to unify pro-Western South Viet Nam with Communist-held North Viet Nam. The South Vietnamese do not favor rushing into these elections.

2. An unconditional ban on atomic and hydrogen weapons and further experiments with them, plus a sharp reduction of conventional armaments.
3. Unification of anti-Communist South Korea and Communist North Korea.
4. An end to power blocs, which they said cause fear and distrust among nations. Before the communique was issued, Khrushchev added a chapter to the brilliant attack he has made on the West, particularly Britain, during his visit in India and Burma. Speaking at a political rally here, he took a swipe at Britain's former Prime Minister Winston Churchill.

Dive Bombers Believed Down

HONOLULU (AP)—Two Marine dive bombers were believed down at sea today after vanishing on a local training flight from Kaneohe Air Station on Oahu Island. Pilots of the two AD-4 Skyraiders took off at 6 p.m. and were due back two hours later. Each plane carried enough gas to remain in the air five hours. Eight planes were ordered to search for the missing bombers.

O'Mahoney Urges Big Three Revision Of Franchises

WASHINGTON (UP)—Sen. Joseph C. O'Mahoney demanded today that the Big Three auto manufacturers liberalize franchise agreements to guarantee that dealers can be "independent businessmen." The Wyoming Democrat praised the General Motors Corp. for extending the period of its dealers franchises from one to five years. The action was announced Tuesday by GM President Harlow H. Curtice. But O'Mahoney said his was only a "short step" which "does not deal with fundamentals, as exemplified by the fact that the termination of the contract can be made in exactly the same manner as before." GM dealers still will be "told

by the factory exactly what they must do to win renewal," although they will be relieved of the pressure of annual renewal, O'Mahoney added. He expressed hope that Ford and Chrysler will join General Motors in liberalizing dealer franchise contracts. He said the Senate Monopoly Subcommittee, of which he is chairman, had not received any complaints from dealers of the smaller auto makers. The subcommittee, which is investigating General Motors' impact on the nation's economy, called top GM executive for questioning today about auto bootlegging, advertising and "leading cars with extra."

The Nebraska New Car Dealers Assn., in a telegram to O'Mahoney, charged auto manufacturers with "failure to control bootlegging" and "coercing franchised dealers into using unethical advertising of 'crazy discount gimmicks' in a wild sales race. Curtice said he didn't intend to volunteer answers to these and other charges of unfair practices made against the manufacturers by the Nebraska dealers. But the Senate investigators indicated they would question the GM executives about them, anyway. One of the dealers' complaints was that their profits had dropped to an all-time low while the Big Three auto manufacturers were enjoying their greatest profits. Curtice has denied that this is now true of GM dealers. He listed their profits for the first nine months of this year at 414 million dollars.
