## Neuberger Hits Flood Control

WASHINGTON — Senator Richard Neuberger, Democrat of Oregon, issued a statement Wednesday in which he blames private power indirectly for the disastrous 1955 floods in New England.

"A great deal of material has come to me," Neuberger said, "from New England about the great havoc wrought by two floods in recent months. Many lives were lost and many homes destroyed."

"Since the Vannort disaster near Portland in 1948, there has been only a negligible amount of flood control storage built in the Columbia Basin. Since that time important flood control sites have been threatened. Yet the Columbia flood problem looms as large as it did in 1948."

The Oregon senator claims private utilities are needed in selling the idea that federal flood control dams with the by-product of power were a form of "creeping socialism."

"Attempts are being made to sell the same bill of goods to the Pacific Northwest," Neuberger concluded. "There is a lesson for the people of the Pacific Northwest in the disastrous floods of 1955 in New England where the private utility program was accepted. Consider the results."

## Russia Gets Shan Islands

TAIPEI, Formosa, (AP) — The official Chinese Nationalist Central News Agency in a report from Hong Kong, said Wednesday the Chinese Reds had turned over the Chu Shan Islands to Soviet Russia as a naval base.

There is no way of confirming the report. The agency attributed it to informed sources.

The Chu Shans are 90 miles south of Shanghai and 310 miles north of Formosa.

Central News reported: 1. The turnover gives Russia a fueling station in the East China Sea, particularly for submarines and a base for possible operations against the American and Chinese Nationalist navies.

2. Six more Soviet submarines were already based in the Chu Shans, and the air strip on Ting-hai, the main island, is being converted into a Russian base under the direction of Soviet technicians.

3. Russian planes already are stationed at the base.

4. The Chinese Reds are building a railroad spur from Ningpo to the coast opposite the Chu Shans as an overland supply line.

## Wilson Lists Fiscal Year Budget Fund

WASHINGTON (AP) — Fourteen years after Pearl Harbor the United States is still faced with the necessity of spending more than 35 billion dollars annually for defense—more than five times the amount for the year just preceding the Japanese attack.

On this anniversary of American entry into World War II, Pentagon fiscal officials were putting into final shape a budget estimate for the next fiscal year which Secretary of Defense Charles E. Wilson says will show no "major" change from the current year's spending figure.

Wilson, emerging from a conference at Gettysburg with President Eisenhower yesterday, said he thought military spending in the fiscal year beginning next July 1 could be held at about 34½ billion—but it would be "pretty tough" to do.

"The fiscal year in which Pearl Harbor occurred, including six months of the war, saw a defense expenditure of \$23,572,000,000. Even before that, the budget had begun to climb as the nation built up its armaments. It had mounted from \$1,559,000,000 in the year ended June 30, 1940, to \$6,071,000,000 the following year.

Wilson has indicated that he expects Pentagon spending to level off, if no major changes occur in the international situation, at about the current rate for the next several years.

The estimates of defense spending that appear in the Pentagon budget are not all the money that goes to armament.

There is in addition a sizable sum, perhaps as much as two billion dollars, for atomic weapons. For reasons of security, the precise annual cost of nuclear weapons production is never made public but about \$1,910,000,000 of items labeled as "major national security" are tabulated in this year's atomic budget totals.

Emphasis for the last three years has been on new weapons, particularly air-atomic power. Indications are that this will be even greater in the forthcoming budget.

As new weapons begin to accumulate, Pentagon planners hope to reduce the annual outlay for the older, more conventional equipment.

## 1956 Business Capital Set

NEW YORK (AP) — Business capital spending in the first quarter of 1956 will climb to a record high, 32 per cent over the pace of booming 1955, Secretary of Commerce Sinclair Weeks declared today.

In an address prepared for delivery at the opening session of the convention of the National Assn. of Manufacturers, Weeks gave this business forecast for 1956:

"For the first six months at least I am confident we'll move to a higher plane—for the balance of the year I'm optimistic."

Weeks said the estimate of capital expenditures in next year's first quarter was made by the Commerce Department, which will make public details of its survey tomorrow.

Weeks said industry can do its part to help maintain prosperity by keeping prices from getting too high, by managing consumer debt and by careful handling of inventory problems to avoid major cycles.

"Insofar as prices are concerned," he said, "there's no occasion today to charge all the traffic will bear and I hope business management will exercise statesmanlike restraint in this respect."

In the keynote address, NAM President Henry G. Ritz III declared that the merger of the AFL and CIO represented a threat to the country's freedom and prosperity.

Ritz, also president of Thomas A. Edison, Inc., West Orange, N. J., said:

"If there is one fundamental American principle which must be maintained so people may prosper, it is the principle of equal application of laws to all citizens."

"Within the last 48 hours, we have seen the amazing in the hands of a few men of the greatest potential economic, and possible political power, in the history of the country."

## Paratyphoid Fever Probed

LANCASTER, Pa. (AP) — State and local health authorities continued their research today into 37 cases of paratyphoid fever in an effort to pin down the source of the outbreak.

The cases have been reported throughout the greater Lancaster area. Most of the victims were children. Three were reported in critical condition today.

Dr. Oscar Davis, county medical examiner, said the only common factor thus far in all cases is that the victims' milk originated at the same dairy. The owner has agreed to suspend bottling while the probe is made.

Dr. Davis said at least two days investigation will be necessary before the source can be determined for certain. Samples of ice cream, milk and similar food products are undergoing analysis.

## Sea Serpent Hopes Blasted

VENICE, Calif. (AP) — Hopes of sightings along this seacoast that they had found a real sea serpent were blasted Tuesday by a scientist.

John Fitch, state marine biologist, identified a 6-foot "whatsit" as a harmless basking shark, fairly rare in these waters.

He said the basking shark swims along the surface of the water and strains small sea life through its teeth.
