Capitol Xmas Tree To Go Up

WASHINGTON (AP) — The White House Christmas tree — a Black Hills spruce 65 feet tall with a trunk two feet thick at the base — goes up today in President's Park.

A gift from the people of South Dakota, the 65-year-old evergreen is scheduled to arrive by rail.

A steel scaffolding 70 feet tall will be erected around the tree. From this, it will take about a half dozen workers three days to decorate the tree. They will use 8,000 lights and ornaments.

On Dec. 18, at precisely 5 p.m., President Eisenhower will light the tree by throwing a switch at his Gettysburg home.

Simultaneously, throughout the world, Christmas trees on government installations—at ships at sea, U. S. embassies and lonely Army bases—will suddenly blaze with light.
