District 2, which formerly embasilet 2, which formerly em-braced Dunsmuir, Mount Shasta, part of Weed, McCloud, Kinyon, Pondosa, Spring Hill and Warren will be changed to include only Dunsmuir and Mount Shasta and areas between and adjacent.

McCloud, Kinyon and Pondosa will be in District 1. with Tule-lake, Mount Hebron, Dorris and Hornbrook, Warren, part of Weed and Spring Hill will be included in District 3. Yreka and adjacent areas will be in District 4.

Old District 4 will become a part of District 5, plus the towns of Etna. Sawyers, Callahan, Somnes, Forks and Cecilville.

The new ordinance divides the electorate as evenly as geographically possible. Jackson explained Following advertising, as prescribed by law, the ordinance will become effective on January 7, 1956.
