## Law Revised In Dunsmuir

**DUNSMUIR** — Dunsmuir's new business license ordinance was revised last night during its first city council reading after two small water companies objected to inequality of license rates.

The fee had been set for \$100 a year to water companies. Representatives of the Shasta Retreat and Van Posen water companies pointed out they only have 20 and 30 customer outlets each. The Dunsmuir Water Company, it was noted has 1,100 customers.

Councilmen changed the rates to \$10 a year for water firms with fewer than 100 outlets, and \$100 for those companies with more than 500 customers. A subsequent reading of the ordinance passed after it was agreed all licenses will be rated on gross business of each firm.

In other business, the council discussed the possibility of obtain-

ing a civil defense warning system siren for use by the volunteer city department. Eleven of the 33 volunteer city firemen now live in North Dunsmuir, where the sound of the present fire siren does not reach.

A resolution passed to purchase nine parcels of tax delinquent state-held land at \$250.



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
