McKay Adopts 'Goon' Label

PORTLAND, Ore. (AP)—Secretary of Interior McKay said last night he didn't remember making the "goon" statement credited to him by Adlai Stevenson, but he immediately adopted it.

"I certainly never said it in any major speech. But what of it? I don't go along with some of the goons in labor—and there are goons—we have had them right here in Oregon," McKay said on a stopover at Portland while flying to Honolulu.

Stevenson's remark in a New York speech had been, "A member of the Cabinet has said he doesn't happen to go along with some of the 'goons' who are running things." An aide said Stevenson was referring to McKay.

McKay had other comments on Stevenson:

"He's just a little man looking for a job—somewhat shopworn, but still looking for a job."

"He's a line one to talk of Cabinet members splitting the nation. The Democrats did more to make this nation class conscious and divide it with their New Deal than has anything else in the country's history."

"Stevenson needn't worry about the country splitting into classes. There will be none of that under President Eisenhower's leadership."

Asked if that meant he knew the President would run again, McKay said:

"No, I don't. But President Eisenhower is the strongest man in the world today for peace. He knows that and it is he who must decide."

"There are only a couple of men who don't want Eisenhower to run again. One of them is (New York Gov. Averell) Harriman and the other is Stevenson."

Lester Turnbaugh To Lead Tulelake Potato Growers

TULELAKE — Lester Turnbaugh was named 1956 president of the Tulelake Potato Growers Association by the board of directors following the annual membership meeting on December 6. Turnbaugh served as vice president this year.

His co-officers will be Lowell Kenyon, vice president and John Bailey Sr., secretary-treasurer.

Association members met at the Sportsman's Hotel to approve the 1956 operating budget of \$20,737, elected two new members to the board, heard the annual financial report, a progress report and postponed the annual membership dinner from mid December to January.

Assets of the association were listed at \$79,774 and liabilities at \$4,350, leaving a net worth of \$75,424 and increase of \$2,180 over last year.

Two three-year terms on the board will be filled by George Voss, succeeding Ronald Ward, and by Earl Shultz, elected to succeed himself after filling out the unexpired term left vacant by the resignation of Charles K. Wiese.

President Ben Reimer read the record of official activities of the association during the 12 months preceding the annual meeting. The office handled 8,023 tons of hay; received 5,257 office callers; made 2,645 telephone calls; sent out 6,730 bulletins, 6,398 other publications and 1,712 letters; made 953 farm placements held 67 meetings; for committees, directors, and memberships and 23 meetings for directors alone.

The same crop assessment rate as this year was established for next season: 65 cents per acre on row crops and 10 cents per acre on other crops, hay, clover, grain.

Louis Lyon, Malin, member of the Oregon Potato Commission, reported on the recent Chicago meeting of the National Potato Council and its plan on developing a long-range program. Lyon tabulated the results of various issues before the council: (1) that a favorable vote on the proposed potato diversion program was registered; (2) that a favorable reaction to the proposal to provide 1/2 cents per sack to the National Potato Council to be used for furthering work of the national council and (3) agreement on the shipping of potatoes under a national grade and federal inspection plan.

Glen Arthur, chairman of the Tulelake field station committee, announced that the committee has been enlarged to include members of other farm organizations to make the committee more representative of the entire agricultural area.

Main objective for this year of the committee was promoting a better attendance at field day programs arranged by the Tulelake field station through the University of California, Davis, and the Tulelake farm adviser.

The annual membership dinner was postponed to January after it

was indicated by Governor Goodwin J. Knight that he would like to visit Tulelake at that time if his schedule will permit. The governor has been invited to speak. Major committees of the association will be appointed at the January 4 meeting.

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Moore To Call Grand Jury

SANTA CRUZ (UP) — Dist. Atty. Charles L. Moore Jr. of Santa Cruz County announced he will call the Grand Jury into session next week for a new investigation of vice.

The 28-year-old Moore made this announcement yesterday after pleading innocent to an accusation of misconduct in office. Superior Judge James L. Atteridge set Jan. 19 for trial.

The accusation was returned last month by the same Grand Jury that Moore plans to call into session for the new investigation.

Foreman Carlisle Blodgett said Moore has not yet asked him to convene the jury.

Moore declined to discuss in detail the new material he claims to have unearthed, except to say it concerned "vice, bribery and extortion."

Meanwhile, his attorneys began issuing subpoenas to a large group of county residents to support his denial of the misconduct charges.

EXPLOSIVES SEIZED

NICOSSIA, Cyprus (AP) — A small quantity of explosives was seized yesterday by British police in a search of 25 Cypriot monasteries. Eight persons, including one monk, were arrested. Violence has been continuous in this British crown colony for the past year as islanders of Greek descent have pushed a campaign for union with Greece.

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
