### Jury To Get Vic Wolf Case

PORTLAND (UP)—A jury was expected to begin deliberation of the fate of Victor Laurence Wolf today as soon as attorney's concluded their final arguments. Both prosecution and defense began their closing arguments late yesterday with Dist. Atty. William Langley contending that testimony showed Wolf guilty of first degree murder.

### Rapist Gets Quentin Term

LAKEPORT (UP)—Thomas E. Sentney, 22, Lakeport truck driver, has been sentenced to San Quentin for the kidnap-rape of a 15-year-old Lakeport girl. Sentney, married and the father of one child, was found guilty of abducting the teen-age girl off Lakeport's main street late in October and taking her to a remote section of Upper Lake, where he criminally assaulted her. He was sentenced to 1 to 25 years on the rape charge and 1 to 50 years on the kidnap charge. The sentences are to be served consecutively.

The 45-year-old electrician has admitted the bomb-slaying of Portland attorney Kermit Smith and the hearing must decide only his degree of guilt.

Defense attorney Nicholas Grant described his client as a man who "missed the boat" all his life and who fell in with Marjorie Smith at a highly critical moment of his life, just after divorcing his second wife.

Two psychiatrists told the hearing today that they felt Wolf could not have committed the murder without some "outside influence."

Dr. John W. Evans said Wolf was a quiet and humble person. He said his love interest was very instrumental in motivating the murder of Smith. Earlier, a Portland detective testified that Wolf was extremely cooperative during the murder investigation and that he held off his confession a few hours apparently to protect Mrs. Smith. Mrs. Smith was recently exonerated by a jury in a trial at Mc Minnville, Ore.

KAMAISHI, Japan (UP)—A 7-year-old mongrel dog named Chirisan was sent here to his master's new home, along with the household goods, from Morioka, 93 miles away. The master took a later train, and found Chirisan missing when he arrived. Twelve days later the dog showed up in Morioka at his old home and had to be shipped again to the new one.

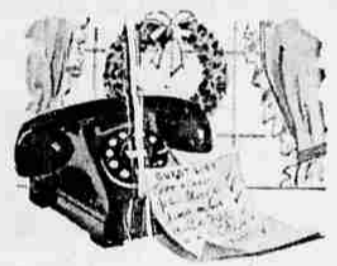
