Jury Clears Sunny Worden

KINGSVILLE, Tex. (AP) — Mrs. Sunny Canales Worden was cleared Monday by a Kleberg County Grand Jury of a charge that she murdered her husband on lonely Padre Island in October. The 42-year-old mother of three children said after learning of the grand jury action "I have been fairly dealt with and vindicated. . . I am deeply grateful." The attractive brunette had been free on \$5,000 bond. The body of her husband, Don Worden, 43-year-old San Antonio Real estate man, was found Oct. 29 in a shallow cove on Padre Island just off the Texas coast near here. Mrs. Worden several days later told Texas Rangers she killed him and buried his body after he had made her dig the grave and said he was going to force her to kill his five-year-old daughter and herself. Mrs. Worden told officers that Worden had beat her, shot at her, and burned her with cigarettes during their brief marriage. She claimed that he got \$90,000 cash and a home worth \$45,000 from her by giving her drugs and hypnotizing her. They were married in Oregon.

Heavy Blizzards Hit Plains Of Canada

REGINA, Sask. (AP) — One of the worst blizzards in years knocked the props from under temperatures and left paralyzing drifts across the Canadian prairies Tuesday. One man was known dead. The body of mounted police inspector D. J. McCombe was found in his snowed-in car in the North Battleford area of northwest Saskatchewan. He had left his engine running to keep warm and died from carbon monoxide fumes. At least four persons were reported missing as the Arctic storm swept over Alberta and Saskatchewan and pushed into Manitoba. Schools were closed, buses stalled, planes grounded and trains slowed by heavy snow whipped across the prairies by winds up to 70 miles an hour. Scores of children were stranded in schools and homes nearby. Authorities in many districts closed classrooms. Regina police hunted a six-year-old boy who left school at the height of the storm and did not arrive home. A truck was sought between Wilkie and Unity, 100 miles west of Saskatoon, and two men were missing in the Kindersley area 115 miles southwest of Saskatoon. Although auto accidents were numerous no deaths were reported. The westbound Supercontinental of the Canadian National Railways smashed into a truck at Wainwright, Alta., but the driver had left his vehicle parked while he helped a stalled school bus and it rolled on to the back. A truck missed a bridge in Regina and plunged into a snowdrift.

Dulles To Ask Tougher Policy

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of State Dulles leaves for Paris today, on his 23rd official overseas visit, to press for closer cooperation by Atlantic Pact allies to offset Russia's tougher diplomatic policy. Dulles is reported ready to announce new moves in public economic and cultural relations as well as more military cooperation by 15 Atlantic Pact members. Secretary of Defense Wilson and Secretary of the Treasury Harold Lloyd will attend the Atlantic Pact council meeting which begins Thursday. The principal purpose of the meeting is to provide an annual review of progress the Allies have made in building land, sea and air defenses against any possible Soviet attack. Dulles also plans to meet privately with British Foreign Secretary Harold Macmillan to review Western European problems. Dulles was reported confident that Paris meeting would succeed in instilling a stronger spirit of cooperation among the Atlantic Pact countries. The East-West deadlock at Geneva, he believes, will serve as a new impetus for the 16 allies to stick together, reversing what he sees as a growing trend toward neutrality prior to the Geneva conference with the Russians.
