Defense Budget Points Toward Stormy Election

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Eisenhower's proposal for a billion-dollar boost in defense spending and a possible battle over tax cuts pointed today toward a stormy election-year session of Congress. The President's plan to step up the production of B52 bombers, jet interceptors and development of the guided missile program won general support from Republicans and Democrats. But the \$5.1-billion-dollar defense budget he outlined to top congressional leaders in a White House briefing yesterday held a threat to tax reductions and budget balancing. Several leaders in both the House and Senate said they saw little chance of substantial tax reductions. Several other issues arose out of two days of White House briefings which signaled forthcoming battles. In individual statements, Democrats and Republicans displayed sharp differences of opinion with each other—and even with their party colleagues—on debt payments, continuance of foreign economic aid, proposed new farm programs, highway financing and school construction.

Syria Sees UN Meet On Protest

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (AP)—Syria expects the Security Council to meet soon on the Damascus government's protest against Israel's attack on Syrian posts in Galilee. Ahmed Shukairy, chairman of Syria's delegation to the General Assembly who announced the protest at a news conference, indicated his country will ask the council to take stern action against Israel. He did not disclose Syria's strategy but said it would call for "measures which have not been asked before." The U. N. Charter authorizes the council to recommend a cessation of aggression. That failing, the council may call on U. N. members to sever diplomatic, economic and communications ties with the aggressor nation. Finally, it may call on members for armed force to halt aggression. The council so far has never voted sanctions against one of the parties in the Arab-Israeli conflict, contenting itself with censuring the nation it considers the guilty party.

Leadership Of Labor Party Inclines Toward Gaitskell

LONDON (AP)—The leadership of Britain's Labor party is going, apparently, to a dapper Socialist who used to wear a derby and carry a cane.

There's a three-cornered race for the job of succeeding Clement R. Attlee. But Hugh Todd Naylor Gaitskell, 49, seems to have the advantage over Herbert Stanley Morrison, and Aneurin Bevan. Results of balloting among the 278 Labor members of the House of Commons are expected late tonight. Gaitskell was 12 when he wore the derby and carried the stick—the uniform of Winchester, one of Britain's most exclusive schools for the privileged classes. He decided a long time ago, however, that his future lay with promoting socialism.

Knight Lashes At Goldwater

SACRAMENTO (AP)—Gov. Goodwin J. Knight said today it would be "unwise and unrealistic" for the GOP to fight organized labor's leaders in the next election. Knight, who had the endorsement of the California AFL in the gubernatorial election, lashed out at Sen. Barry Goldwater (R-Ariz.) and other Republican leaders at a news conference. "I can think of no more unwise counsel than for the Republican party to declare war on any leadership in the country if the leadership is sincere and honest," Knight said. Knight who expects to be a "favorite son" candidate at the Republican National Convention next year, said Goldwater is wrong "if he thinks we can win by antagonizing labor." Knight said the GOP had lost ground with the farmers and in the South and "if there is just the bona-fide, slipshod Republican voting on our side, we're going to lose." Knight volunteered his opinion to newsmen after calling their attention to a story by a syndicated columnist, Victor Riesel, that President Eisenhower and GOP leaders had decided to "declare war" on top officials of the newly merged AFL-CIO. Knight said Republicans won the presidency in 1952 because Mr. Eisenhower "attracted the independent vote and the labor vote and I hope the Republican party will continue that policy."
