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Jaycees, Chamber To Hold Annual Meeting In January

LT. Col. Robert H. Larson, senior project officer at the Klamath Falls Air Force jet interceptor base, told chamber of commerce members Wednesday that a representative of the Air Force will speak at the joint annual meeting of the chamber and Junior Chamber of Commerce.

The annual meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, January 11, at the Willard Hotel, at which time the Jaycees will name this year's Distinguished Service award winner.

A. D. Addison, current chamber of commerce president, told directors at the regular board meeting Wednesday noon at the Winema Hotel, that an Air Force representative has been asked to speak at the joint report meeting, to outline the role of the local base in the overall defenses of the nation.

With Col. Larson at the chamber meeting were Maj. Thomas Gerbing, executive officer, and Maj. O. D. Whitten, installations engineering officer.

Chamber Manager R. Frank Tucker reminded members that chamber of commerce dues are deductible from income tax returns, according to an opinion from the commissioner of internal revenue.

James Patterson, director in charge of memberships, announced plans for a one-day concentrated drive for members on Friday, December 23.

George Barich, chamber of commerce traffic manager, said that the Pacific Inland Tariff Bureau is considering lowering the classification of plastic pipe which is manufactured locally by Carlon Products, Inc.

Barich said a request for lowering the plastic pipe freight rate classification was made at a meeting which he attended Tuesday in Portland. The bureau, headed by George F. Davis, of Portland and

Klamath Falls, regulates freight rates charged by Oregon motor carriers.

Results of the request will be announced in a few weeks, according to Barich, and should result in an increase of Carlon's manufacturing and distributing potential.

At present, plastic pipe two inches in diameter and over is classified double first class, making shipment almost prohibitive. This size pipe represented 137,000 pounds of plastic pipe manufactured by Carlon in the first 11 months of 1955.
