

### Perry Como To Give Kirk Close Shave Over TV Show

HOLLYWOOD (UP)—An ex-barber will lather up Kirk Douglas' face and shave off his \$270,000 beard Saturday night—with millions of television viewers looking over the shaver's shoulder.

This 10-minute drama has no script and can have no rehearsal. "The ex-barber to whom Kirk is trusting his famous face is Perry Como, who'll scrape away on his program."

Douglas drew \$270,000 to grow his beard for his role as painter Vincent Van Gogh in one of MGM's big pictures for 1956, "Lust for Life." When the film was completed Monday, Como was inspired to bid for the shaving job.

"But I'm not even tipping him," said Douglas as he packed to take off for the New York show. "Jack Benny suggested that I'm flying 3,000 miles to get a free shave!"

Douglas claims he gave Como a little practice with the razor by sending him a case of fuzzy peach. "I have one cleft in my chin. I might end up with two. And what if MGM calls me back for re-takes on 'Lust for Life'?"

Douglas' magnificent growth of red (dyed) beard is no ordinary face decoration. Eight years ago he decided he wanted to play the life of Van Gogh. He became determined when Director Jean Neufesco told him he resembled the famed Dutch artist. Kirk painted whiskers on a Douglas photograph to prove it.

The actor was planning to produce the picture when MGM notified him it had the same idea, and wanted to hire Douglas for the movie.

For six months Douglas grew his beard, an old talent as he also wore one for "Gyuzer." The film was shot in Van Gogh's home and studio in France and at MGM. "I like a beard," he said. "You can hide behind it—sit quietly and look interesting. People assume you're thinking deep thoughts." "But when Como asked if he could shave it off, I thought it was a good idea. I've done everything else on TV. I played the banjo on Jack Benny's show, sang and danced for Ed Sullivan and did gymnastics with George Gobel." "Of course," he added, "Como hasn't barbered for years. If he cuts my throat, the show will end quickly."

### Fort Rock Well Drilling Permits May Be Processed Soon

FORT ROCK—Well drilling permits for this basin which are pending may be processed soon, according to information from the state engineer's office. Oregon law requires a water right filing with the state engineer for pumping water for a well for irrigation similar to those filed for water from surface streams.

A statement released by Lewis A. Stanley said: "The U.S. Geological Survey has recently furnished us a preliminary report on the ground water situation in the Fort Rock Basin and I believe we now have sufficient information to make a preliminary determination as to the amount of water which can be permitted to be withdrawn in certain areas of the basin."

"The applications for permits which are now on file and which have not been approved will be carefully considered in the very near future. I am of the opinion that permits may be issued on some of these applications without further investigation."

When the well permit question first came up in late August, it was the feeling in this region that

further applications would be refused, at least temporarily. Commenting on his department's position, Stanley said: "There has been no restriction on the filing of applications for permits to appropriate ground water in the area. Such applications will be received and filed at any time they are presented, provided they are in proper form. I intend, however, to examine each application carefully and to approve only those for which the geological studies show a water supply available."

It was indicated that so far no protests have been filed against any applications for irrigation wells anywhere in the Fort Rock Basin. Asked about the possibility of the large springs at Summer Lake being an outlet for the underground body of water, Stanley said: "There has been no suggestion to this office that the ground water of the Fort Rock Basin is the source of Ana River Springs. The profile of the ground water table in the Fort Rock-Silver Lake area indicates that water may be sinking into the earth in the vicinity of

Hole-In-The-Ground, eight miles northwest of Fort Rock, but where this water goes is pure speculation at the present time."

Information from the Portland Current Records Center of the U.S. Geological Survey show that the ground water level is the highest of record for this time of year. Their most recent water level data was of December 1. These records show a generally rising trend for

several years, although the level has remained almost unchanged since August.

### UAL Engineer Strike Ends

CHICAGO (UP)—A seven-week strike of flight engineers against United Air Lines ended last night. An airline spokesman said a settlement negotiated in Washington provides that the 252 strikers will be returned to the payroll "on or before Dec. 19 without discrimination or disciplinary action."

United maintained service throughout the strike by using qualified pilots as flight engineers, thus touching off an interunion dispute which resulted in suspension of the Air Line Pilots Assn. from the AFL.

The AFL-CIO Flight Engineers International Assn. struck United Oct. 23 when the company rejected a union demand that flight engineer jobs be limited to men holding airframe and engine maintenance licenses. United ruled that all newly hired engineers must be qualified pilots.

Company and union spokesman said the settlement provides for United to give pilot training to engineers and for flight engineers who do not want to become pilot-engineers to continue as flight engineers alone.

### Police Hunt Car-Clue

LINCOLN, Neb. (UP)—Police were hunting today for a car reportedly seen outside the little white home where a young housewife was strangled yesterday.

The victim was Nancy Parker, 22, wife of City Forester Darrell F. Parker. He found her dead when he returned home for lunch after trimming a Christmas tree in the state capitol.

It was not immediately determined whether she had been raped. Two workmen told police they saw a dark blue Ford, 1949 or 1950 model, outside the Parker home shortly after Parker left early yesterday. The house is in the city's Antelope Park.

The workmen said they saw no one in the car and did not see it leave. Parker found his wife's body on a bed, tightly knotted around her neck was a piece of twine. A rag was stuffed in her mouth. Her hands were bound behind her and she was half clothed.

In Omaha, 60 miles away, police continued the search for the slayer of another woman, Carolyn News, 20-year-old University of Omaha coed. She was found dead in a campus road last Saturday.

There was nothing to link the two slayings.

COLUMBUS, Ohio (UP)—Santa Claus will aid in keeping marriages together in two southwestern Ohio counties during the Christmas season. Judge Darrell Hostie of Highland County Common Pleas Court said he will not grant any divorces between today and Jan. 3. Judge John Case of Fayette County Common Pleas Court issued a similar decree covering this month.
